
Day 8: Slow Shutter Speed & Light Painting.

- Lighting painting requires you to shoot in a DARK ROOM with the windows shut and curtains closed. Turn
 off all the lights, and put a towel by the door to not allow any light to come in. You might need to hide in a
 dark closet or bathroom to do this assignment, or even shoot at night.
- Get a flashlight, or download the app Glow Stick onto your phone. You can even get saran wrap and get a
 marker to color the plastic, to act as gel to allow for colored light. Finger lights and glow sticks work well
 too.
- Download the Slow Shutter Fast Camera App and set your settings like this:



- Grab a model and have them move the flashlight in a way that draws something. It's important to hold the camera very still or place it on a tripod or rest the phone on the table supported by something.
- Take at least 3 photos of your subject. This project is definitely going to test your patience, but please try to get it right. If you notice that your pictures are too bright play with your shutter speed and sensitivity.
- Pick your best three shots, edit them and place on a collage for google classroom.
