Additional Notes on Next Gen Accuplacer:

We have moved completely to Knowledge Assessment now and the college no longer uses Accuplacer as a diagnostic, but we will honor all prior scores for up to four year. If you need help understanding Accuplacer Next Gen scores, here are some notes:

For the math subject test, all students started on the QAS section of the test (i.e. Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, and Statistics). If the student scored a 263 on QAS, they automatically moved to the AAF section (Advanced Algebra and Functions).

For the writing subject test, students were only presented with Writeplacer if they scored between 250 – 256. The Writeplacer section of the test is computer-graded, except in a minority of cases.
