~ A Message from the Fort Shaw Elementary Principal ~



The first trimester has been a successful time at Fort Shaw! Students have been hard at work diving deep into the learning objectives their teachers set forth. Teachers have challenged the students and helped them develop a growth mindset. We want to instill perseverance and determination into our students at FSE.

We have created a "makerspace" in our old library area. We call it the Tiger Lounge. Students are able to come in twice a week during their recess time to be creative, use critical thinking skills, collaborate with others, problem solve, and innovate. They can choose from numerous activities. Students can do things like build with Legos and K'nex, play strategy games like chess and Monopoly, and code on the computer. Other activities will be developed and added throughout the school year. The kids have really enjoyed using the makerspace. I have had such a great turn out each time. If you happen to have any old electronics that work or don't work, such as computers or old stereo equipment that you don't want to have around, we would love to have it in our makerspace. Students would be able to take those apart and experiment with them. Please contact the office or drop them off. Thank you!

Students and staff have been practicing fire, lockdown, and evacuation drills. It's very important that we practice these throughout the year so we are prepared for any type of emergency. We practice the routines and procedures to ensure our school will be as safe as possible. We also have a new addition to our security measures using a secure entrance system. During school hours all the doors are locked. The only way to access the building is through the secure entrance system at the front door located by the office. If you want to enter, you have to push the button and identify yourself so a staff member can open the door for you. We are trying to be prepared for any type of emergency situations and keep FSE a safe environment. The new entrance system will aid in doing so.

Our teachers have continued to receive literacy training provided by the Montana Comprehensive Literacy Project that our district was awarded. Each month the teachers are observed by an Office of Public Instruction liaison and a literacy consultant. They give teachers feedback and suggestions on how to improve their instruction. Staff have also attended literacy trainings and can continue to do so on their own time once a month. Teachers have spent numerous hours developing their instructional techniques and strategies, compiling student data, and implementing new literacy programs and resources. All of this will improve instruction and student achievement. I want to thank the staff for all their hard work and dedication to the students at FSE!

The District has scheduled a ski trip to Showdown on Friday, December 14th. Third through fifth grade students are allowed to go. This is a great opportunity for students to start skiing at an early age and stay active during the winter months.

Fort Shaw Elementary is hosting a Christmas Concert on Tuesday, December 18th, @ 2:30 p.m. in the FSE Gym. Please come and join us to listen to our elementary students fill everyone with Holiday Spirit!

Our kindergarten through second graders are going to the Fort Shaw Community Center on Thursday, December 20th, to go caroling and spread some cheer! What a great thing for those little students to be a part of. I want to thank Mrs. Davidson for setting it up and also putting on the concert.
