

# STRUCTURE

#### THE METHOD USED BY AUTHORS TO ORGANIZE INFORMATION

Standard: 7B33 Identify, compare, explain, interpret, describe and analyze how text organization clarifies meaning of non-fiction text.

Noting the transition clues in a paragraph is often the key to solving the mystery of its organization.

Transition clues help you see the relationships between ideas.

As a reading detective, you must use the clues that you can find to try to deduce the main idea by studying the supporting details.

There are hundreds of different clue words.

# WE NEED TO RECONGNIZE TEXT STRUCTURE!

## Top 5 Text Structures

How an author organizes information, ideas, and events in a text is called text structure. Understanding different text structures can help you understand the purpose of the text you are reading.

COMPARE

The text shows how two or more

AND CONTRAST

#### ESCRIPTION

The text includes details about a person, place, or thing that helps you picture it in your mind.



As You Read, **Ask Yourself:** 

What is being described? How is it being described? What does it look like? How does It work? What WORDS does it do?

SEQUENCE The text describes the order in which things happen.



As You Read, Ask Yourself:

What Items, events, or steps are listed? Do they have to happen in this order? Do they always happen in WORDS this order? first, next, then

What things are being compared? In what ways are they allke? In what ways are they different?

CAUSE AND EFFECT

The text describes something that happened and why It happened.



As You Read, Ask Yourself:

What happened? How or why did it happen?

> WORDS because, since therefore, as a result

**PROBLEM** AND SOLUTION

#SCHOLASTIC

The text discusses a problem and gives possible ways to fix it.



As You Read, Ask Yourself:

What is the problem? Why is this a problem? What can be done to solve the problem?

> to solve this, since, due to, so, because. as a result

Sometimes an author will use several text structures in one piece. For example, your social studies book may be written in chronological order (in order of years) but may also contain a section that explains cause and effect.

Notice the job the transition clue is doing to help you understand what you read.

### STRUCTURE (ORGANIZATION)



- » You will need 4 pieces of paper.
- » Create a staggered group of papers place the 2<sup>nd</sup> layer about ¾" above the bottom layer, 3<sup>rd</sup> layer, about ¾" above 2<sup>nd</sup> layer, last layer ¾" above that; then fold down so top paper is ¾" above the last.
- » Write TEXT STRUCTURES topmost flap.
- » Flap #2 Descriptive Text Structure
- » Staple onto colored notebook paper





### Meet a Woolly Mammoth

Before becoming extinct, the Wooly Mammoth was able to survive in a cold climate for several reasons. It had long tusks that it could use as shovels to clear snow from the ground to reach grass and plants buried below. Its trunk ended with two "fingers" that enabled it to pluck grass. Its body was covered in fur. In fact, its belly fur could be three fee long. To prevent heat loss, its ears and tail were small. Finally, a nearly four inch layer of fat under its skin helped to keep it warm.






Organizing the Information

reedom's Journal was alweekly
newspaper. It was the first American
newspaper owned and created by blacks! It
was formed on March 16, 1827 in New York
City. This seems fitting, since slavery was
done away with in New York state that same
year. The paper was four pages long. The
editors ran articles of current events. They
also ran editorials or opinion pieces. The

- 7also ran editorials or opinion pieces. The paper printed th8 black viewpoint; this was missing from papers run by whites. The paper
- **9**covered issues such as slavery, the right to vote, and returning free blacks to Africa.

These issues were important to blacks. The edito wanted to educate their readers. They share both local and national news as well as news from other parts of the world. Freedom's Journal Inly lasted for two years. However, that wasn't the end of black-owned and operated newspapers. Others were formed around the country. When the Civil War broke out, there were more than 40 papers that could have reported the news from a black point of view.
