Diagramming Simple Sentences

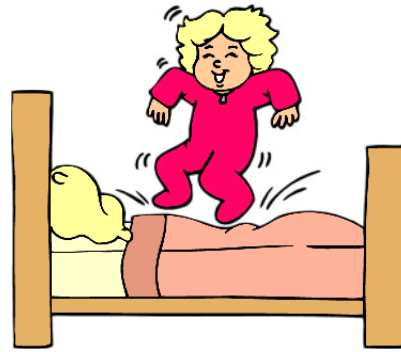
Every sentence must have a noun and a verb.
