Breathe In, Breathe Out: Making a Diaphragm Model

- 1. Cut out the four pieces around the edges.
- **2**. Cut the 2 short slots near the underarms for the rib pictures to slide into.
- **3.** Cut along the line above the boys head.
- 4. Cut along the curved line in the middle of the boy's shirt.
- 5. Insert the rib pictures into the two side slots and glue them down.
- 6. Pinch together the BREATHE IN end of the long piece and insert it into the straight slot.
- 7. Thread the picture behind the boy inserting BREATHE IN end through the curved slot.
- **8.** The BREATHE OUT end of the long piece should be through the straight slot.
- 9. Open the pinched ends back up so the long piece does not come out.
- **10.** On the left side of the boy, list the following structures: (recall body directions!)

Mediastinum	Bronchioles
Pleura	*Alveoli
Lungs	Diaphragm
Trachea	*Epiglottis
Bronchi	Ribs
