You will also learn to use the tools and functions of Adobe Photoshop to take your photographs to a more creative level of expression.

1. Learn the basic theories of digital photography (exposure, lighting, shutter speed).

2. Make informed decisions about composition and design.

3. Understand the controls and functions of cell phone cameras.

4. Learn how to use Adobe Photoshop to enhance and modify photographs.

5. Critique and reflect upon their work to better understand the creative process.

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6. Explore and develop creativity, creative expression and personal voice.
