

Digital Photography Final Screencasting Project

Your final project is to create a screencast that highlights three projects or photoshop lessons that you feel that you did your best on/are the most proud of. In your screencast, you should describe the following:

1. An explanation of the project/full description of the lesson that you are highlighting in your video.
2. An explanation of the work that you put in to make your projects or camera techniques used when creating your photographs and edits. Try to answer the question "How did you make that?" Feel free to use your cornell notes to help you quickly explain the processes you did to create your work.
3. Explain a difficulty that you had while creating your works being shown and how you overcame or got around your issue.
4. Lastly, a description of what you learned or how this lesson helped your understand or learn about something.

To Make a Screencast:

You can create a screencast in a multitude of ways--but the easiest way that you do it on your Macbook is to open up Quicktime. You can easily find quicktime in the Applications folder. Once you open up quicktime, it will show you a window finder that looks like you can open up a video or other file. Rather than opening something, press the following keys at the same time: Command+Control+N. This will bring up a tiny box that will allow you to select to use your microphone. Hit the Record Button and it will record your entire screen/voice. To stop recording, press on the red stop button on the top task bar (by the time/battery level). Once you have finished, you can choose to edit your video in iMovie--or you can turn it in if you are happy with how it came out. Attach your .mp4 video to Google Classroom and hit the turn in button.

Once your video has loaded, please delete it as it will take up a TON of space on the Macbooks. Let me know if you need help making sure that it's been successfully deleted. Also, it will always be accessible to you via Google Drive because you will have turned it in via classroom.
