Use a flashlight to cast shadows on a wall and tell a short story.	<b>1.N.1.2 Place Value</b> Using 2 cards, create a 2-digit number. Tell someone how many tens and ones are in your number. <i>34 has 3 tens and 4 ones</i> Repeat 4 times.	<b>1.1.2 Community Helpers</b> Draw a map of your community. Label places where people work together. (schools, hospitals, police stations, and others you think of.)
<b>1.2.PWS.1 Decode Words</b> Read the following sentences and draw a picture for each one. The flowers are blue and red. The hot sun is big and yellow. The pink pig likes to play in the mud. My dog is big and brown.	<b>1.PS4.3 Day and Night Sky</b> Draw two pictures: one of the day sky and one of the night sky. Label and talk with a person about the source of light in each picture.	<b>1.N.1.6 10 More/10 Less</b> Create a 2-digit number and find 10 more and 10 less. Repeat 4 times.	<b>1.1.2 Thank You Card</b> Write a thank-you card for a community helper to express gratitude for their work. Pick one from below to write to. <b>1.3.R.3 Story Elements</b> Build a blanket fort and take a fiction book inside. Why is this place important? (It is the home of the President of the United States.)
<b>1.3.W.1 Narrative Writing</b> Watch an episode of your favorite cartoon. When it ends, write the story for the next episode. Be sure to include the characters, setting, and beginning, middle, and end. Add illustrations to your story.	<b>1.LS1.2 Animal Family Skit</b> Act out a short skit with friends or an adult pretending to be different animal families. Showcase how parents and offspring interact.	<b>1.N.1.3 Whole numbers</b> Make up a story to create a “Some, some more” and “Some, some went away” stories. Use pictures to show what happens in the story. Create 2 addition and 2 subtraction stories.	<b>1.1.1 Law and Order</b> Draw a picture showing people following rules and laws. Discuss with an adult why having rules is important for a community.
