How did the weather forecast help Oklahoma City prepare for the weather?	<b>K.N.1.5 Counting On</b> Using a deck of cards, turn over the top card and count from that number to 20. Use beans, macaroni, or other counters to help. Repeat 3 or more times.	<b>K.3.3 Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow</b> Draw a picture of what you did yesterday. Draw a picture of what you are wearing today. Draw a picture of what you want to eat tomorrow.
<b>K.4.R..1 Vocabulary</b> Choose 10 items from around your house. Have an adult help you sort them in different ways they are similar and different.	<b>K.ESS2.1 What to Wear</b> Look outside your window. What is the weather like today? What clothes do you need to wear if you go outside today? Why do you think you need to wear the clothes you picked? Draw a picture of you wearing the clothes you would wear outside today.	<b>K.A.1.2 Patterns</b> Use a deck of cards to create patterns: <i>Example: Red, black, red, black</i> or <i>9, 1, 9, 1, 9</i> Repeat 3 times.	<b>K.3.4 How do I Learn About the Past?</b> Look around your house. Is there anything that could tell you about things that happened in the past? What are some other ways you can learn about the past? Would these items help you learn about the past? (photographs, videos, diaries, listening to people tell things that happened in the past, books) Can you think of any other ways to learn about the past?

What direction does it go when you pull it?	<b>K.GM.1.1 Shapes</b> Look around your house. Try to find squares, circles, triangles, rectangles. For fun, draw it!	<b>K.4.1 Needs and Wants</b> A need is something you need to survive. Which one of the items below do you need to live? Which items are something you just would <b>like</b> to have and want? Video games, food, popcorn, shelter, stuffed animals, phone, clothing
<b>K.3.W Writing</b> Draw a picture of a favorite toy. Then label the items in your picture. Write down all the beginning sounds that you hear.	<b>K.PS2.2- Change of Speed</b> Find an object that you can roll. Can you make your object roll slowly? Can you make your object roll fast? What did you do differently to make your object roll fast?	<b>K.N.1.8 Comparing</b> Using a deck of cards. Turn over two cards. Compare values using “more than,” “less than,” and “equal to.” Say <i>4 is more than 2</i> Repeat 5 times.	<b>K.2.4 Map of Community</b> Draw a map of your community, including details such as the post office, the school, and the grocery store.
