

Distance Learning FAQ's

Question: What will be the primary means of communication between schools and parents/students?

Answer: The primary tools for communication between teachers and families will be through phone calls, parent provided email addresses, Remind, Seesaw, or Google Classroom.

Question: Who should I call if I have questions about my child's homework?

Answer: At this time, please call your classroom teacher if you have questions.

Question: How will my elementary students receive homework?

Answer: Students will receive weekly homework through one of these methods:

- email
- guardians will pick up in the school entryway
- packets will be mailed home
- in limited cases delivered by bus with the food delivery

Teachers have established with their students' family the best way to ensure the lessons are delivered.

Question: What quarter of the school year will we be in on March 30th?

Answer: Students will be in their fourth quarter and should follow fourth quarter schedules.

Follow the school dress code• Regularly monitor online platforms• Engage in all learning with academic honesty• Communicate proactively with your teachers if you cannot meet deadlines or require additional support• Comply with School Internet Safety policies including expectations for online etiquette

<p>One teacher each day will be communicating to you or your child. Parents/Guardians or student will be asked to respond that they have received the communication.</p> <p>Provide support for your children by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Establishing routines and expectations • Defining the physical space for your child to study • Monitoring communications from your child's teachers • Beginning and ending each day with a check-in • Taking an active role in helping your child process his/her learning • Establishing times for quiet and reflection • Encouraging physical activity and/or exercise • Remaining mindful of your child's stress or worry • Monitoring how much time your child is spending online • Keeping your child social, but set rules around their social media interactions
