Marysville Public Schools strategically focuses on standards, teaching, school design, leadership, funding, school support, and partners. Because of this, parents are encouraged to be a part of the decision-making process for the district. They are also heartened to volunteer and support the district's vision to ensure that, "Every student will excel, both personally and for the benefit of humanity."

Please review the table below for the listing of our schools. During the 2016-17 academic year, no new "Priority" or "Focus" schools were identified. Even so, some "Priority" or "Focus" schools did exit their status in the state because they met the necessary exit criteria. New "Reward" schools were identified using school rankings and "Beating the Odds" evidence. A "Focus" school is one that has a large achievement gap between the highest and lowest achieving 30% of schools. A "Priority" school is one whose achievement and growth are in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A "Reward" school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings list, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or

"Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels; in these cases, no status label is given.
