Instructions:

- Please use <u>black or blue ink</u> to fill out application.
- o Application must be complete to be considered for an award.
- o Please fill out one application for each child.
- For Westwood Recreation Department programs, please obtain a registration receipt from Beth Roper, business manager of the Recreation Department, 781-355-8097, and submit with this application (copies are acceptable). The application and registration receipt may be left with Beth Roper, who will submit them to the Westwood Community Chest.
- o **For all other programs**, include camp registration forms and/or camp invoice/bill and submit with this application (copies are acceptable).
- Summer Campership Applications <u>must be received no later than May 20th</u> to be considered.

Please note:

- All Applicants <u>must</u> be Westwood residents <u>and</u> of school age, K (by September 2016) through Grade 12.
- The Awarding process is confidential. Applications will be reviewed on the 20th of each month (March-May) and recipients will be notified within 2 weeks of review.
- There is a Summer Campership award <u>limit of up to \$800 per child, not to exceed \$1,200 per family per fiscal year</u>. Please note that there are limited resources and awards are granted on a "first come, first served" basis.
- Summer Campership Awards are mailed directly to the camp, not to the applicant, which is why you must include the registration receipt/form and/or invoice/bill for which you are requesting payment.
- Applications for Financial Award and Summer Campership Award are considered separately. Families are encouraged to apply for both, if needed. A family who has reached or may reach the financial award limit of \$1,000 for basic needs expenses, would still be eligible to apply for a Summer Campership Award.

Please join us for a booktalk presented by Rabbi Emeritus Henry A. Zoob A LIFETIME OF GENESIS

For many readers of the Bible, there are two major obstacles to the enjoyment of scripture: comprehension and relevancy. In *A Lifetime of Genesis*, Rabbi Zoob seeks to help the reader overcome these obstacles. In clear, logical prose, Rabbi Zoob explains the course of the Covenant of Abraham in Genesis and how each major player- Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Sarah, Rebekah, Rachel, and Leah—has an impact on the development and continuity of the Covenant of Abraham. He solves the relevancy problem by sharing stories from his life that are connected to the patriarchal and matriarchal events and themes in each previous chapter. Rabbi Zoob hopes that his use of this midrashic process to discover personal insights will encourage the reader to do the same. Rabbi Zoob served as the rabbi of Temple Beth David of Westwood for thirty-six years. He became the temple's Rabbi Emeritus in July 2006.





Birthday Wishes is a Massachusetts-based non-profit that brings the magic of a birthday party to thousands of homeless children each year.

With a simple act of kindness, Birthday Wishes was founded in the fall of 2002 by three friends who organized a birthday party at the Second Step Shelter in Newton, MA, hoping to let their own children experience the joy of helping others. The guest of honor was a five year-old boy. Neither his mother nor the shelter could afford to thrown him a party.

Now in its fifteenth year, Birthday Wishes serves children living in more than 200 family shelters and transitional living facilities across Massachusetts, Rhode Island and Long Island, New York, thanks to some 500 volunteers every month. In 2016 32,000 homeless children experienced a Birthday Wishes party.

A combination of anecdotal evidence, academic research, and program evaluation tells us that birthday celebrations build self-esteem and provide a sense of normalcy not often experienced by homeless children. The Birthday Wishes program ensures that every birthday child we serve knows the day he was born was a very special day.

We have 2 types of birthday party programs: On-Site, which take place monthly at the shelters and celebrate all children celebrating birthdays that month; and Birthday-in-a-Box, which provides a party box and gifts to families living in domestic violence safe shelters, hotels, and scattered sites.

All of the birthday parties are run by carefully trained and background-checked volunteers, who participate as individuals, families and groups. Our grassroots philosophy fosters the spirit of volunteerism and community service in the adults, children and families who donate their time and resources. Powisset Farm Trail Run
