## Westwood Youth & Family Services Structured Play Groups



### Group Description:

These 8-week groups are designed to emphasize the continued development of adaptive social and conflict-resolution skills as well as build self-esteem and confidence. Organized play and drawing activities are used to reinforce weekly topics such as initiating & developing friendships, working cooperatively as a team, appropriate communication and recognizing personal strengths. Structured play groups are free of charge and offered to all Westwood children in K - 5<sup>th</sup> Grade.

Please note: All groups meet from 4:00 - 5:00 PM and are coed. Groups consist of approximately 6-8 children and are co-lead by two clinical staff from our department. ### Volunteer → Be a Mentor → Make a Difference

### MENTOR PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

Youth & Family Services is seeking Mentors to volunteer in the following programs for the 2015-2016 school year.

Westwood Youth & Family Services' Mentor Program strives to provide high school students with a meaningful volunteer experience in their local community. Students have significant responsibility as role models and are the most valuable resource of the Mentor Program!

### **BODY SAFETY THEATER**

Who: All high school students

What: Mentors rehearse and perform a series of skits for all Westwood 3<sup>rd</sup> graders, which teach basic rules about body safety and sexual abuse prevention. "Auditions" are typically held in January and no previous acting experience is necessary.

When: Mentors attend rehearsals one evening per week through the winter months. Performances are typically in the spring.

### BULLYING PREVENTION THEATER

Who: All high school students

<u>What:</u> Mentors rehearse and perform a series of skits for all Westwood 6th graders, which teach various aspects of social problem-solving and bullying prevention. "Auditions" are typically in October and no previous acting experience is necessary. <u>When:</u> Mentors attend rehearsals one evening per week through the fall. The performances are typically in January.

### FRIENDS NETWORK

Who: All high school students

What: Friends Network thoughtfully matches each Mentor ("Big Friend") with a student in the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, or 5<sup>th</sup> grade ("Little Friend"). Pairs meet to play games, talk, engage in art activities, and have fun together.

When: The Big Friend/Little Friend pairs meet weekly on Wednesday evenings at the Council on Aging from 6:30-7:30 PM from November – April. Friends Network Mentors <u>must</u> be able to keep this weekly commitment as their little friend will be relying on them to be there!

### TEEN CENTER

Who: Juniors & Seniors only

What: Teen Center aims to provide safe, fun dances for 6th, 7th, and 8th grade middle school students. Mentors serve as chaperones and role models for the middle school students. Other responsibilities include helping with set up, clean up and facilitating other structured activities such as basketball.

When: Teen Center dances occur approximately 4-6 Fridays throughout the year. Mentors volunteer on a rotating basis and participate from 6:30PM—10:30 PM on the Friday evenings they are scheduled.

### THURSTON THURSDAY CLUB

Who: Sophomores, Juniors & Seniors only

<u>What:</u> Thurston Thursday Club aims to provide a safe, social, and recreational environment for Thurston Middle School students. Students gather to eat snacks, play games, hang out with friends, or do homework if they choose. Mentors are responsible for facilitating and supervising the Club activities, while serving as role models for younger students.

When: Thursday afternoons from 2:25-4:00 PM. Mentors attend Thursday Club on a rotating basis.

### FIRST PARISH TO HOST VOICE WORKSHOP


