We truly feel we are the hidden gem of Trumbull County.

We had various capital improvement projects going on during a busy 2016-2017 school year. In the high school, we replaced our failing steam conversion boilers with much smaller high efficiency hot water boilers. This move also allowed us to clear out a sizable amount of space once the old boilers were removed that we could use for additional storage. We also installed Bolo Stick devices in district classrooms as an extra measure of security in emergency situations.

We have numerous initiatives for the upcoming 2017-2018 school year as well. This summer, we replaced a section of the roof on the high school side. We will also be sealing the parking lots since it has been more than a few years since the last time. New cafeteria tables should be in place or on the way and they will more practical for cleaning and set up/tear down for events needing that space. We are also hoping to add more Chromebooks district wide in an effort to meet state testing requirements.
