# Requirements for consideration of applicants:

• Academic 3.0 grade Point average: at the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> semester of

Sophomore - Junior year

• Service: Volunteering (doing for others without payment) Community involvement

outside of school (4-H, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, etc.)

Leadership: Church, Community (4-H, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, etc.) Classroom,

Extra-curricular activities, class or organization officers

• Character: ethics, trustworthy, punctuality, high morals, helpful, law-abiding, honest,

and motivated

# **Acceptance into the Deubrook National Honor Society:**

1. Complete application form

2. Application reviewed by DHS faculty committee

# **DNHS Membership Requirements:**

#### **Attendance:**

- Required to attend DNHS Induction Ceremony (April each year)
- Required to attend all organized events where all members are needed. (meetings, fundraisers, etc.)
- 4 hours of involvement in non-required activities that falls under service.
- If you are found out of compliance, you jump to the third time out.
- In the case of an emergency, you speak directly with Mr. Keenaghan

# Dismissal Process for Academic Eligibility:

- Example:
  - ✓ Not maintaining a 3.0 g.p.a. each quarter after being inducted for membership
    - ❖ Warning for the quarter g.p.a. is under 3.0
    - ❖ Dismissal at the next grade check at quarter or semester

### **Dismissal Process for Service-Leadership-Character Infractions:**

- Advisor gives:
  - ✓ 1<sup>st</sup> warning (warnings last calendar year)
  - ✓ 2<sup>nd</sup> warning
  - ✓ 3<sup>rd</sup> infraction = dismissal process
- Warning examples:
  - ✓ not showing up/absent from event without excuse
  - ✓ attendance
  - ✓ tardiness
  - ✓ inappropriate behavior (swearing in the hall, etc.)
  - ✓ receiving Saturday school
  - ✓ poor sportsmanship
  - ✓ disrespectful
  - ✓ revoked privileges
  - ✓ drug/alcohol/tobacco use
  - ✓ not following the school code of conduct -cheating
- Dismissal impending

In all cases of impending dismissal for service-leadership-character issues, a member shall have a right to a hearing before the Faculty Council.

Advisor note: This is considered "due process" for all members
