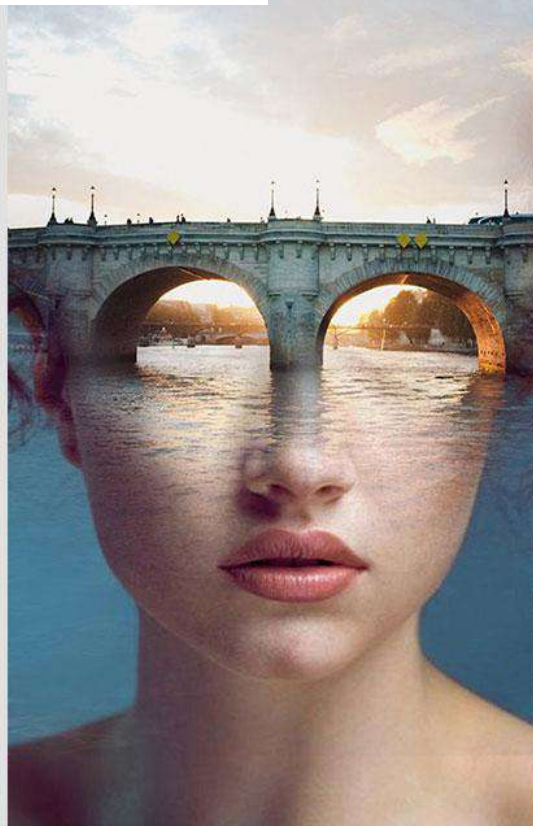
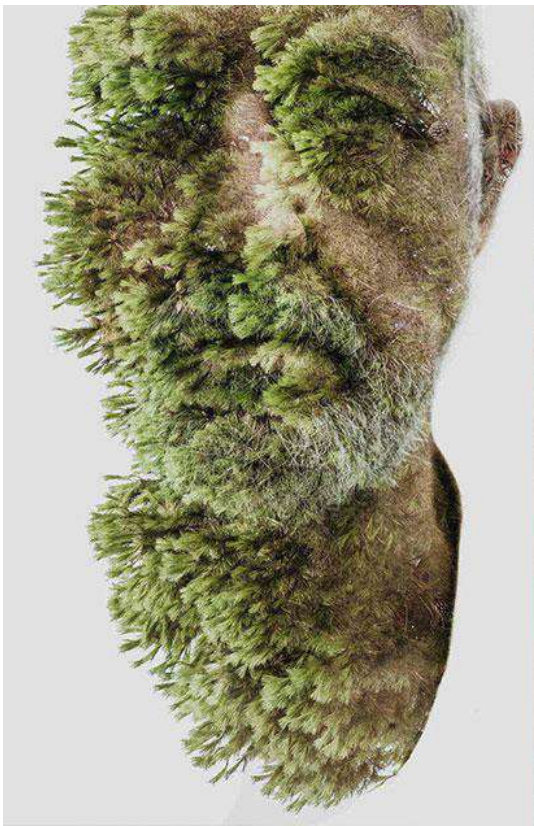


Double Exposures



Sandwiched Images

Taking two different images and stack them in photoshop. Then adjust the opacity on the top layer.











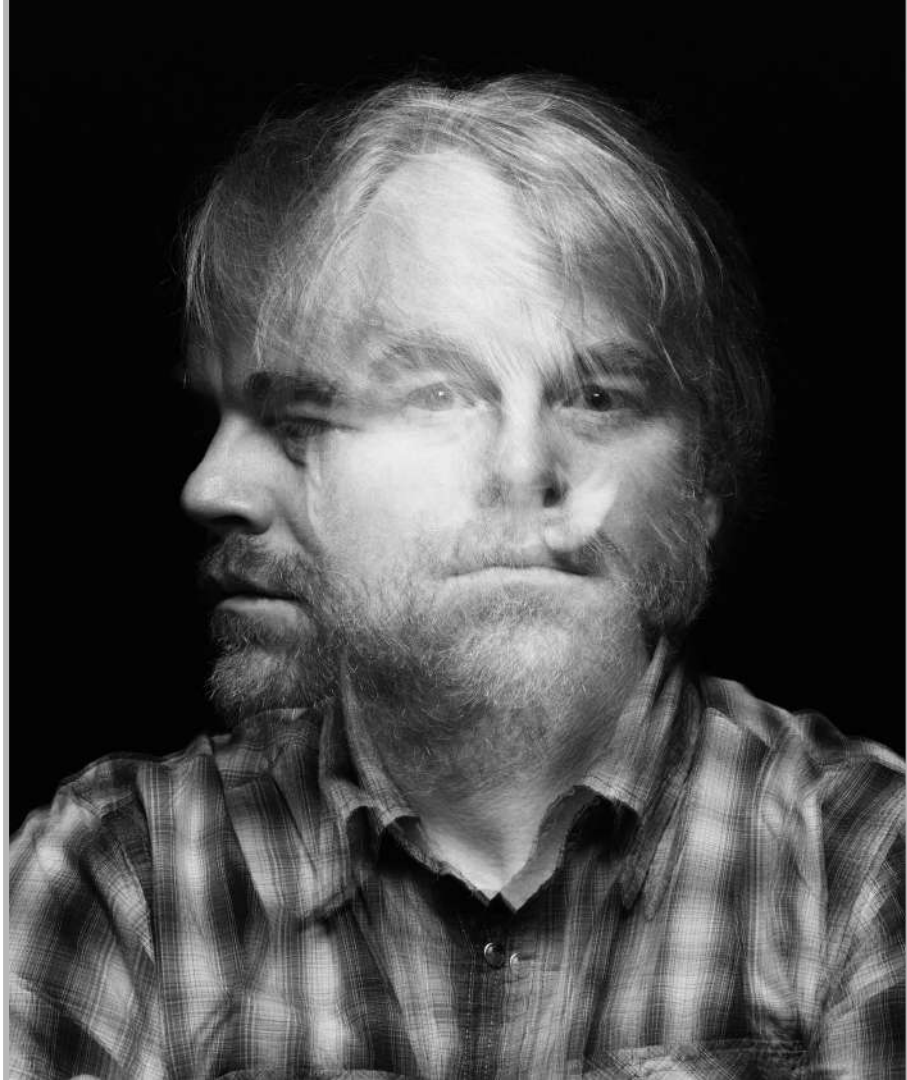






Movement Double Exposure

Taking two similar images and stacking them in photoshop. Then adjust the opacity on the top layer. This creates a feeling of movement or passage of time.







Bottom/Top Left/Right Double Exposure

Using two different images to create one image. Both images are at full opacity and are blended together from top to bottom or left to right to create an illusion of one cohesive image.

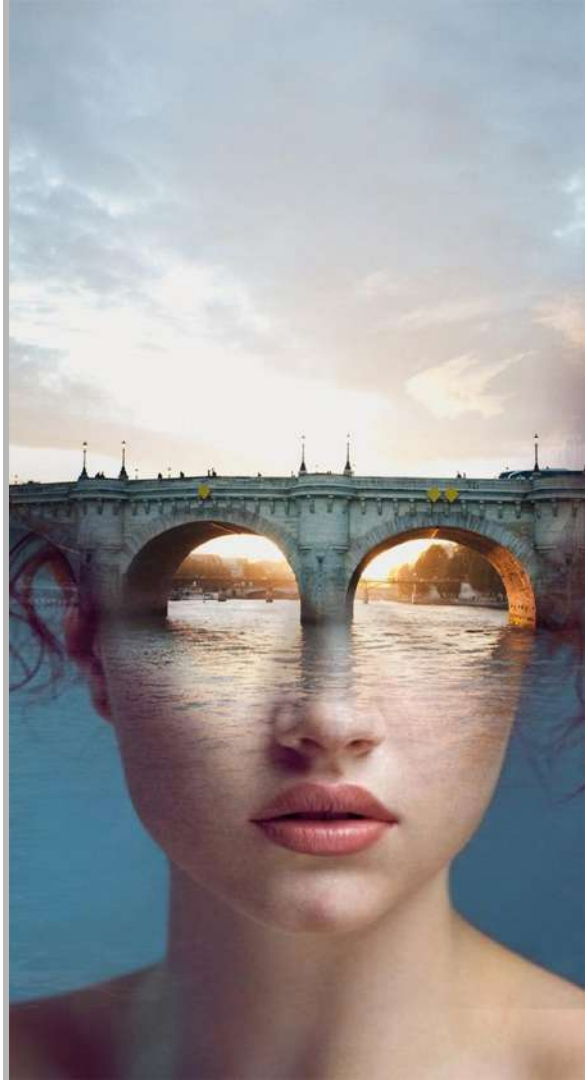












Selective Opacity Double Exposure

Using two different images to create one image. Stack the images. The opacity will vary throughout the image to create one cohesive image.







Silhouette Double Exposure

Using two different images to create one image. Stack the images. Only apply the second image into a silhouette. Either remove the background of one image and only show the other image inside of that image, or photograph the main subject on a solid color background.
