Memorial Scholarship

CUMPSTON, Dr. William "Billy," of Baltimore, Md., died Wednesday, Aug. 20, 2003, in Johns Hopkins Hospital, Baltimore, from a lengthy illness from Lyme Disease and Lupus.

Billy was born Sept. 16, 1973 at Wheeling Hospital, son of Keith D. Cumpston and Sandra S. Reid Cumpston.

He was a member of the Episcopal Church in Baltimore, where he taught Bible classes and worked with the youth.

Billy was a graduate of Cameron High School; Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, Md.; Biola University; Rosemead School of Psychology; Talbot Seminary, LaMirada, Calif.; Loyola College, Baltimore, Md. George Washington University, in Washington, DC had accepted him for the Ph.D program in philosophy this fall.

Billy was presently employed by Hero-Mental Health and psychological associates in Columbia, Md. He had been the learning disability specialist for Baltimore City Community College, Baltimore, Md. He worked at Johns Hopkins as a psychiatric therapist; the Awle Treatment and Rehab Clinic as a mental health therapist and case manager; Friends Research Institute as a study coordinator and group facilitator, Hollywood, Calif.; Harbor U.C.L.A. Medical Center, Carson, Calif. as a research assistant; psychology Extern at Whittier School District, Whittier, Calif.; counselor for Biola University, LaMirada, Calif.; private practice in Hacienda Heights, Calif.; Behavior Data Specialist at Kennedy Krieger Institute, Baltimore, Md.; interned at Sheppard Pratt Hospital, Baltimore, Md; Research Assistant at Johns Hopkins Hospital and Johns Hopkins University.

Billy served as missionary to China and Hong Kong. He worked with orphans at Agape House orphanage, and cooked at our Daily Bread Shelter. He was fluent in German, Chinese and Spanish.

He was a member of the American Counselor Association and a private tutor and ESL instructor.

Billy's life was devoted to helping others, his God, his family and his education were the most important things in his life.

He was preceded in death by his grandmothers, Clarice Quigley Reid, and Hanna Jean Robinson Cumpston.

In addition to his parents, he is survived by a sister, Clarice Shantel Cumpston of Cameron, his grandfathers, James P. Reid and John H. Cumpston of Cameron, many uncles, aunts, cousins and friends.

The family wishes to express heartfelt gratitude to all the wonderful friends that attended the memorial service in Baltimore, Md. that came from all over the world, and to the two most wonderful people in his life, Hee Sung and Ray Chan.

Dr. Billy Cumpston Memorial Scholarship

The Dr. Billy Cumpston Memorial Scholarship was established to assist worthy and needy Cameron High School graduating seniors (without regard to race, national origin, religion or sex by providing scholarship assistance) to help pay for expenses at a four-year institution.

The Dr. Billy Cumpston Memorial Scholarship provides a one-time \$500.00 scholarship award for a student who is accepted and enrolled in a recognized college (4-year institution). The scholarship recipient needs to attend school within the first year following graduation.

The selection committee shall act by a majority of their number. Their decision in awarding this scholarship shall as to all persons be conclusive and no recipient or applicant shall have any claim – legal or equitable against the selection committee or sponsor of this scholarship. Scholarship awards may be subject to the availability of funds.

The student will receive the scholarship award at the beginning of the second year of his/her four-year program. To receive the award check the student must provide documentation of grades (minimum of 2.5 GPA at the end of first semester or end of freshman year). If recipient does not achieve a 2.5 GPA at end of freshman year the scholarship will be revoked. Grade documentation is to be sent to Sandy Cumpston who can be contacted at 304-686-2385.
