Tradesperson:

Someone who has the skills to do a certain job.

A tradesperson is someone who learned a specialized skill for their job.

Weave:

To make a piece of fabric or a rug out of thread on a loom, you move the threads over and under the one before it.

Women would weave thread together to make fabric.

Kneaded:

To mix the flour and other ingredients in bread, the baker kneads the dough.

My grandma kneaded the dough before putting it in the bread pans.

Trade:

Exchanging something you have with something someone else had so that both people have what they need.

Farmers went into town to trade or barter goods and services they had for those they needed.


