The Pilgrims were a community of people who left England together and set up a colony called Plymouth Colony.




Religion: The belief in a God or a group of Gods.

forward: If someone is asked to come forward in the classroom, they are asked to come to the front of the room.




disappointed: A person is usually disappointed when things don't go as they planned.
