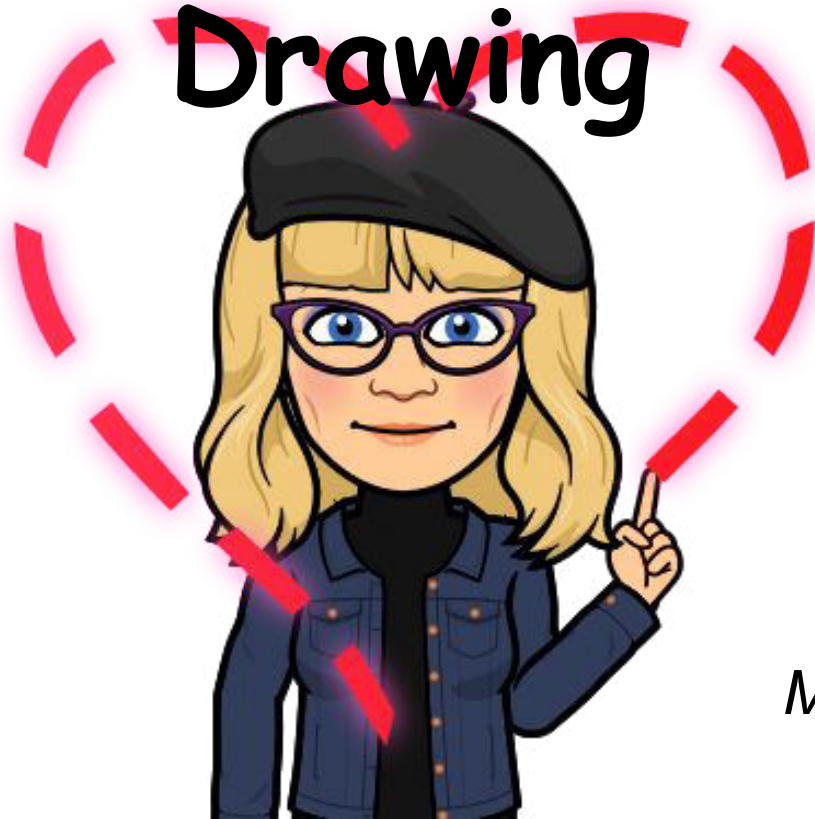

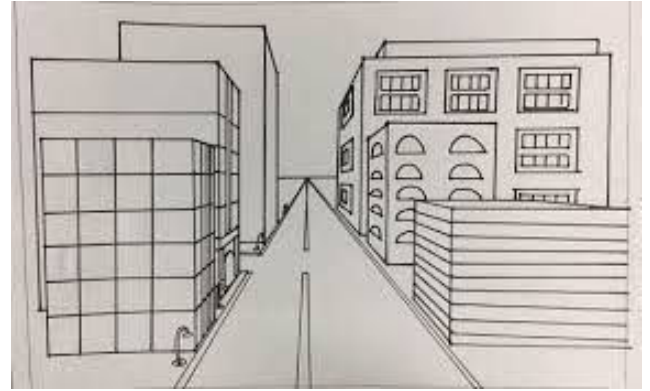
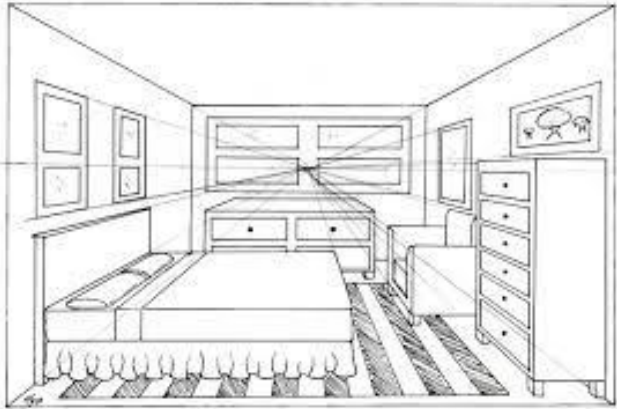
Have you ever wanted to design the bedroom of your dream?

Start by making a list of what YOU want in your room:

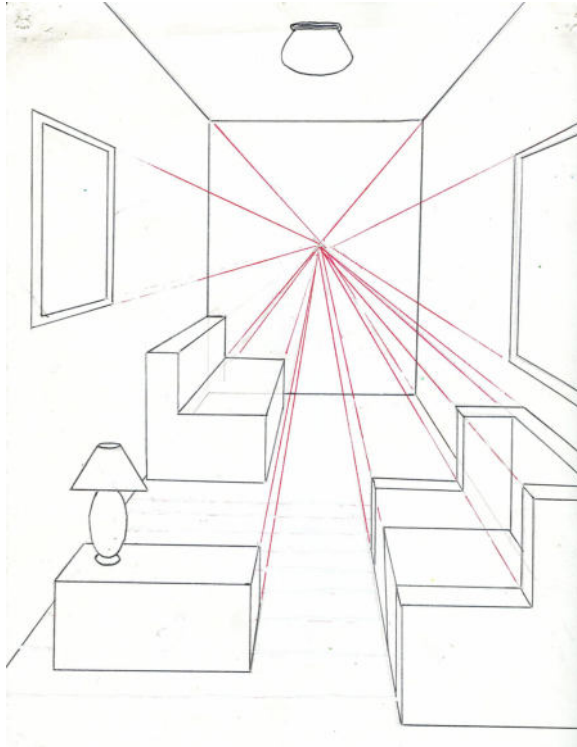

What is Linear Perspective?



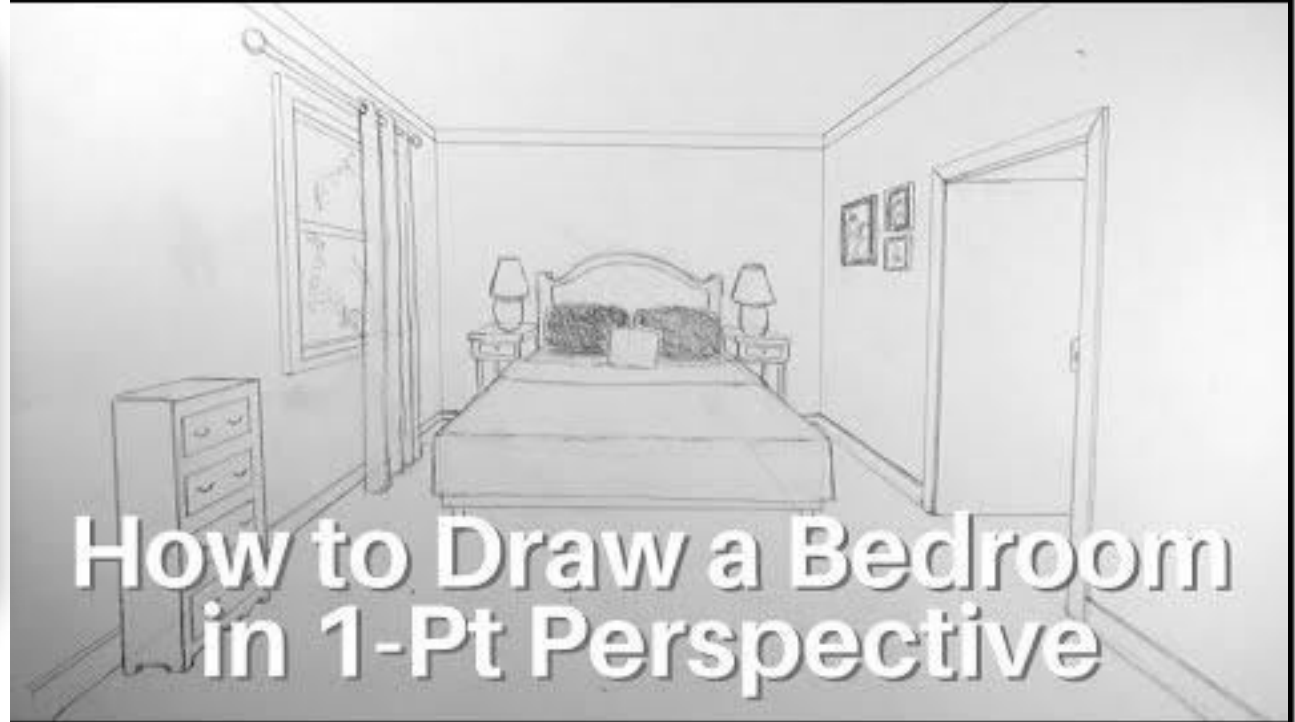
Linear perspective, a system of creating an illusion of depth on a flat surface. All parallel lines (orthogonals) in a painting or drawing using this system converge in a single vanishing point on the composition's horizon line.

One Point Linear Perspective



One point perspective is a drawing method that shows how things appear to get smaller as they get further away, converging towards a **single 'vanishing point'** on the horizon line. It is a way of drawing objects upon a flat piece of paper (or other drawing surface) so that they look three-dimensional and realistic.

In your sketchbooks practice drawing a room STEP by STEP. Stop the video as needed!

How to draw a Cylinder



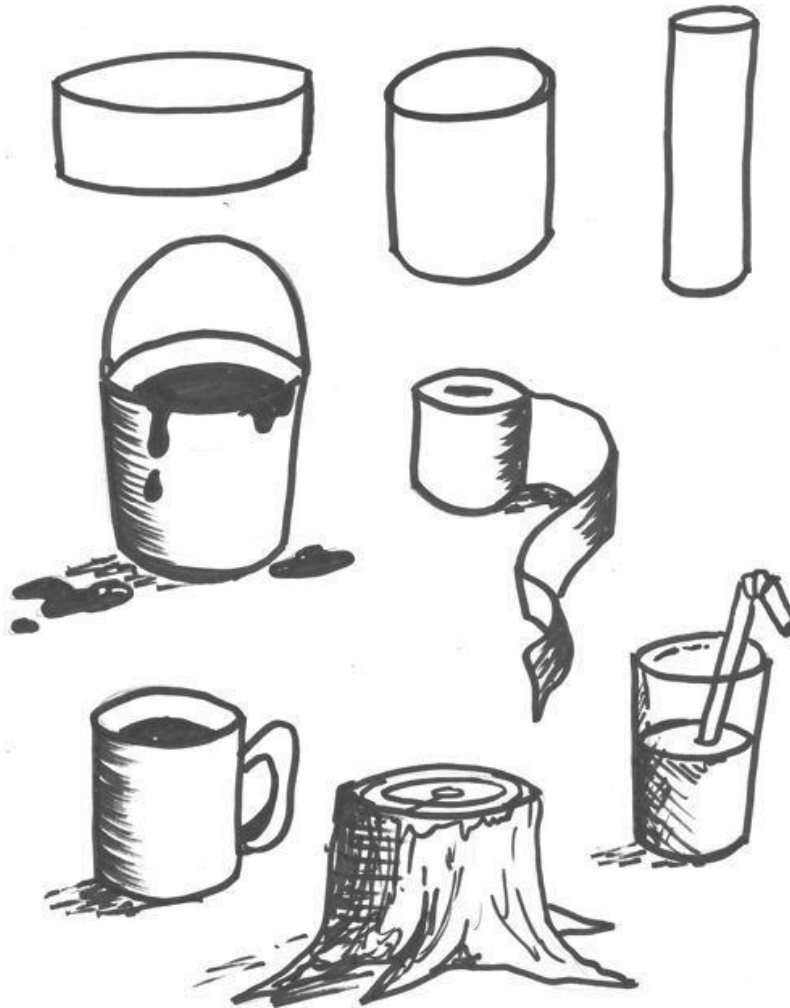
Step 1:
draw a pancake



Step 2:
add table legs



Step 3:
**connect the
bottom corners
with a smile**



PRACTICE

On a separate page practice drawing some of the pieces of furniture you want in YOUR dream room.

How can you use one point linear perspective to make what you want?

Use FORESHORTENED circles to draw cylinder and then make something you want for your room!

Draw several items on one page so you don't waste paper.



Assignment

On a new clean piece of white paper map out your bedroom. Remember to “keep it light until you get it right!” If you press too hard you’ll have a difficult time erasing lines when things overlap!

Carefully add your furniture. **REQUIRED** items: Bed, table, chair, window, lamp or ceiling light. **REQUIRED:** 2 items you created using cylinders. **REQUIRED:** 2 **YOUR** choice items, (YES you can have more)!

When you are done with your **LIGHT** pencil drawing, carefully outline using a black ball point pen. *Ink can smear so **STOP** and let it dry for a minute while working.

Watercolor paint each item. *Let one area dry before painting next to it or the wet colors will fuse together.
