WHAT IS DUAL CREDIT?

- Dual credit is an opportunity for high school students to enroll in postsecondary institutions in South Dakota while earning credits for both their high school diploma and postsecondary degree or certificate at the same time.

WHAT IS DUAL CREDIT?

- Courses are offered through the six South Dakota Board of Regents (SDBOR) institutions and will transfer between each of the six SDBOR institutions, including:
 - Black Hills State University
 - Dakota State University
 - South Dakota School of Mines & Technology
 - South Dakota State University
 - University of South Dakota
 - Northern State

WHAT IS DUAL CREDIT?

- Courses available through South Dakota Technical Colleges may or may not transfer to other postsecondary institutions in South Dakota. Technical Colleges include:
 - Lake Area Technical College
 - Mitchell Technical College
 - Southeast Technical College
 - Western Dakota Technical College

WHAT IS DUAL CREDIT?

- Select dual credit courses are available to high school students in grades 11-12 for \$50.84 per credit. Students are responsible for the cost of course credits and any required textbooks or related course materials.
- A typical course is 3 credits.
 - 3 credits X \$50.84 = \$152.52 + books or related course materials
- When you're a freshman at a SDBOR school
 - 3 credits X \$300* = \$900 + fees, books, related course materials
 - * Approximately, will vary

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO TAKE DUAL CREDIT COURSES?

- High school junior eligible to enroll in a high school in South Dakota who meets one of the following requirements:
 - a. earn an ACT composite score of 24 reflective of the 70% percentile; or
 - b. rank in upper one-third of their graduating class; or
 - c. earn a cumulative GPA of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO TAKE DUAL CREDIT COURSES?

- High school senior eligible to enroll in a high school in South Dakota who meets one of the following requirements:
 - a. earn an ACT composite score of 21 reflective of the 50% percentile; or
 - b. rank in the upper one-half of their graduating class; or
 - c. earn a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 on a 4.0 scale.

WHO SHOULD TAKE DUAL CREDIT COURSES?

- Important Skills to Have:
 - Good time management skills
 - Motivated
 - Organized
 - Focused
 - Willing to work hard

WHAT SHOULD I KNOW?

- Students are responsible for completing their dual credit course work even when HHS is not in session.
- Some courses will have prerequisites, ACT admissions requirements, etc.
- The student is responsible for communicating with the professor for any assistance with coursework
- HHS will accept the dual credit grade as given by the college. It will not be weighted.
- The final grade will go onto the student's permanent record and will be factored into their GPA and class rank whether it is a passing or failing grade.
- Students will receive $\frac{1}{2}$ credit for a college course lasting one semester.

WHAT SHOULD I KNOW?

- Dual credit courses may be considered into my eligibility for school activities and NCAA certification.
- There is a possibility my eligibility to obtain Student Federal Financial Aid may be affected by taking dual credit courses.
- If a student fails a dual credit course, they are no longer eligible to enroll in dual credit courses.
- A student's future college (out of state or private) may not accept dual credit grades/credits as transfer grades/credits.

WHAT CLASSES SHOULD I TAKE?

- Colleges and universities have General Education Requirements
 - Like our requirements at HHS in order to graduate
 - **THESE ARE THE CLASSES YOU WANT TO TAKE!**
- All South Dakota universities and tech schools have 4-Year Plans, 4-Year Course of Study, or 4-Year Program Guide that you can find on their website based on the major you might have in mind.
 - USD – 4-Year Program Guides
 - SDSU – Academic Advising Guide Sheets
 - NSU – find the major and click on Plan of Study
 - BHSU – find major, courses listed

The application period for the Spring 2025 semester opened on November 1. Please make every attempt to submit applications at least one week prior to the first day of the semester (January 13).

Students enrolled in South Dakota high schools will be required to enter a passcode to access the application. Please contact your High School Official to access this code.

What is Dual Enrollment?

Dual enrollment is any college course taken by a high school student that counts for both high school and college credit. High school students applying to take courses prior to high school graduation will utilize this application. Several types of dual enrollment courses fall under this application, which are described below:

High School Dual Credit Program

Through the High School Dual Credit (HSDC) program, current high school juniors and seniors enrolled at public, private, and tribal high schools have the opportunity to enroll in college coursework at the rate of \$50.84 per credit hour (or 1/3 of the total reduced credit hour rate). The State of South Dakota pays the remaining tuition costs.

For students to participate in the program, their high schools must have a signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the South Dakota Department of Education ([see the list of high schools with an MOU here](#)).

All courses meet the System's General Education requirements at all six Regental institutions. They are taught by university faculty and offered face-to-face at BOR campuses and online. In some cases, high

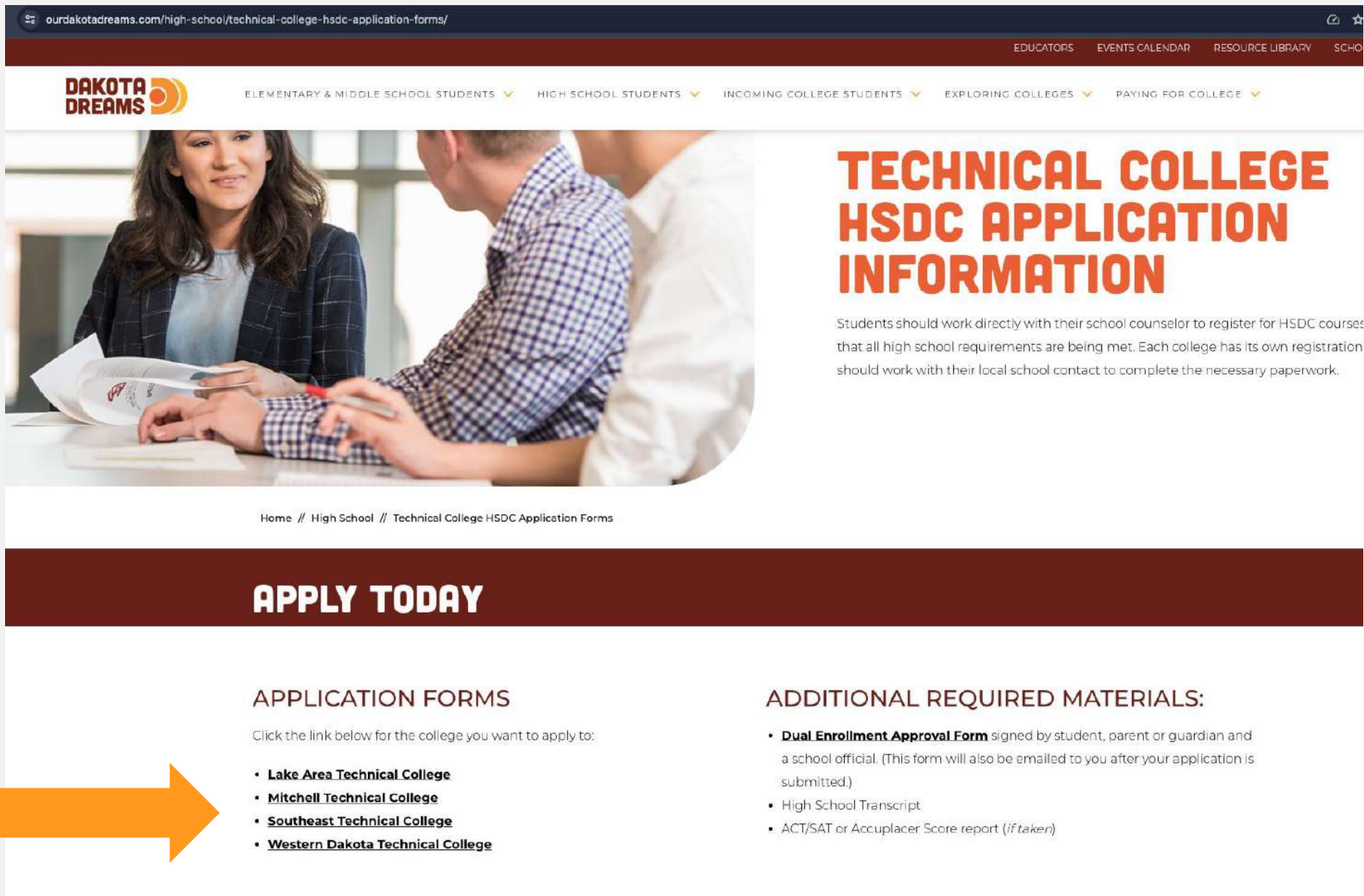

- **Dual Enrollment Approval Form** signed by student, parent or guardian and a school official. (This form will also be emailed to you after your application is submitted.)
- High School Transcript
- ACT/SAT or Accuplacer Score report (*if taken*)

OTHER QUESTIONS?

- How do I pay for my course(s)?
 - You will receive a bill directly from the university/technical institute either electronically or by mail.
- How many dual credit courses can I take?
 - A student is limited to 9 credits per semester. Typical course is 3 credits.
- Will these credits transfer to any other university?
 - Not necessarily. It is the student's responsibility to check with any institution outside of the BOR and state's technical system about the ability to transfer these courses.
- What happens if I enroll into a class and want to drop the class after the drop deadline?
 - Students who drop a Dual Credit course may not be eligible to take any other Dual Credit courses in the future.
