Empowering Students to Achieve Excellence

We are excited to welcome back our students for the fall 2021 school year in a more normal environment.

- The first day of school is Wednesday, September 1st.
- School will start at 7:22am and students will be released at 2:04pm.
 - Busses will drop students off at 7:12am and doors will be open at 7:12am
 - Breakfast will be grab and go fashion and will be free to all students. Students will grab breakfast and proceed directly to advisory
 - Advisory period starts at 7:22am
 - Students will be released from school at 2:04pm
- Our class schedule will be similar to this past year with students taking 5 classes that will be 65 minutes long.



Student Cohorts

- Majority of 8th grade classes will be scheduled in the 400 & 500 wings
- The majority of 9th grade classes will be scheduled in the 500 wing
- 10th, 11th, & 12th graders will be scheduled in the 200, 100, and 00 wings
- Exceptions
 - All Science courses will be taught in the science wing (100 wing)
 - All Art courses will be taught in the art wing (200 wing)
 - All PE courses will be taught in the Upper and Lower Gyms.
 - All Music classes will be taught in the Music Suite and Auditorium



2021 - 2022 Class Schedule

- Students will take 5 classes per semester which are approx 63 minutes in length with one rotating Long Block (90min) each day
- Teachers will teach 4 classes each semester (8 total for the year)
- 8th grade Math, ELA, and Science will be year-long
- All 9th grade English, Algebra and Geometry classes will be year-long
- All 10th grade Math and English Classes will be year-long
- All Advanced Placement courses will be year-long

We have been working with our district nurse and local board of health regarding lunch in the cafeteria. We will be limiting capacity of students eating lunch in the cafeteria.


To do this without having students eat in classrooms or the gym we will be utilizing the cafeteria (outside on picnic tables when it is nice), and the library.

With this configuration we will be able to have 230 students in the cafe & about 90 in the library.

Students will be allowed to eat outside on the picnic tables when it is nice out.

Covid Protocols

- Masks have been voted on as policy by our school committee.
 They will be revisiting the needs for masks every 30 days.
- Masks will be expected indoors.
- Masks are not required outdoors.
- DESE/Commissioner Riley sent out guidelines on August 16th.
 We will be following those guidelines.

We Excelled on all AP Exams

- US History Global Average of 3 or Better 48% State Average of 3 or Better 58% DY US
 History AP Score 84% of our students scored a 3 or better
- O AP Chem: out of 11 reported one 5, three 4, and seven passed with 3 and higher. DY average score is **3.0**, state **2.81**, global **2.67**.
- AP Phys: out of 8 reported, four 4, seven passed with 3 and higher. DY average score is
 3.38, state 2.54, global 2.32.
- AP Psychology DY pass rate 59.34% state 54.6% and global average 53.3%
- AP Calculus state average 2.91, global average 2.81. DY average 4.0. Percentage of DY students with 3 or better 100%
- AP Biology 78% of DY students scored a 3 or better the state average was 68.8% Global Average was 61.4%

- We performed two plays.
- We had a full athletic program.
- Our incredible band and color guard did not miss a beat and continued to be impressive.
- Our volleyball team won the the Cape and Islands League Regular Season Championship.
- Our Art Department and English Department created an incredible mural in the Library with the help of Jen Edwards.
- John Antonuzzo's advertising class worked closely with community businesses to help develop advertising campaigns to improve those companies.
- We implemented The Senior Capstone Project which was a huge success.

- Amy Chausse, Lisa Fedy, Dale Fornoff, and Emma Ethier wrote an innovative pathway grant for \$21,000 dollars to create a health service pathway.
- Then to keep busy they wrote another grant this spring and were awarded another \$30,000 to continue the health services innovative pathway.
- We held an incredible prom, senior week, and graduation.
- We held the first WAVE Olympics run by Mandy McSharry, Dan Robles, and their WAVE crew.
- Virtual Pep Rallies, Spirit week.

- Our E-Sports team competed in the State Tournament.
- Guidance held their senior parent breakfast, junior parent
 conferences, and helped our students choose a school or career that
 they wanted and would be successful at.
- We had over 50 seniors take a college course at 4C's or at Mass Maritime.
- We ran all our co-curricular activities and clubs.
- Our number one priority has always been to connect students with all we have to offer.
