Grade Level News

3rd Grade:

In 3rd grade, our scholars are working on determining the main idea when reading a non-fiction text and writing opinion paragraphs in English and Language Arts. In math scholars are working on rounding and word problems.

4th Grade:

In 4th grade, our scholars are participating in a class book discussion while reading Chocolate Touch. In math our 4th graders are learning about fractions and working on multiplication.

5th Grade:

Has your phone number changed?
