

## Creating Quick Slideshow Movies with iPhoto and iMovie

An easy way to capture the essence of a fieldtrip, or develop a quick presentation using photos and images, is to use the powers of *iPhoto* and *iMovie*.

In essence, you follow these steps:

- upload your photos to *iPhoto* (or share someone else's *iPhoto* library\*\*)
- open *iMovie* and access your photos there
- create your slideshow
- add sound from a CD
- export your show as a QuickTime movie.

(\*\*Follow the attached directions on how to set your computer to share your teacher's *iPhoto* library)

Open *iMovie*


In the dialogue box that appears, click **Create Project**

Name your project with your name (ex: Mary Smith) making sure that it is saved in the shared folder which is the default.

1. In the *iMovie* window that appears make sure the **photos** tab is highlighted

2. Click on the drop down box and select the **iPhoto** library you want

3. Make sure the rest of the settings are the same as shown here




4. Click and drag the photos you want in the order you want from the **iPhoto** library into the timeline

5. Create a title for the beginning and end


- Make sure the **title tab** is selected and choose your type of title
- Click on the **title type** and drag it into your timeline where you would like it displayed

6. Type what you want your title to say in here



7. Place a music CD into the CD drive  
Drop down this menu until your CD shows

8. Drag the track you like into the timeline



\*Edit the part of the music that goes beyond the slideshow in the timeline

**Save your work**

Go to **File>Share**

You will save as a **QuickTime for web streaming**---save to the **desktop** initially and then place in your documents folder after it is collected
