

Hello Families! It's hard to believe the school year is almost over. Our implementation of The Zones of Regulation has been extremely successful, and we plan to continue using the language and strategies next school year.

If you'd like to continue to use the language with your children over the summer months, here are some easy activities:

- Use a visual to "check in" with your child about which **Zone** they are in throughout the day.
- Make a Coping Skills Toolbox for home with a set of "go to" regulation strategies (Play-doh, Legos, paper, markers, crayons, squishy items, stuffed animals, pop-its, etc.)
- Pull out old family pictures and talk about the event and which **Zone** the people were in.
- Encourage your child to draw or journal about their summer experiences and the corresponding emotions. Use the journal as a conversational tool.
- When watching television or movies, intermittently stop and ask your child what the characters are feeling and why.
- Act out emotions with toys and name the motions that the toys are demonstrating.
- Incorporate mindfulness activities into your daily and weekly schedule, including mindful breathing, body scans, a visualization techniques to promote relaxation.
- Take a family walk and point out the different sounds heard, notice the various outdoor smells, feel the different textures, and notice the sun, wind, and clouds.
- Guide your child through relaxation stretches/yoga.

From the Desk of Ms. Lu, Certified School Nurse:

Dear Parents/Guardians:

The PA Department of Health has made changes to the school immunization regulations. These regulations are intended to ensure that children attending school in PA are adequately protected against outbreaks of vaccine preventable diseases. There are two immunization rule changes that we want to draw your attention to:

1. Immunization Rules for First day of school and Enrollment into School


On the <u>first day of school (returning student and newly enrolled)</u>, unless the child has a medical or religious/philosophical exemption, a child **must** have had at least one dose of the required vaccinations or risk exclusion from school. Previously, parents had up to eight months to complete the necessary immunizations. This provision no longer exists and immunizations <u>must be</u> <u>completed by the start of school or first day following enrollment.</u>

2. New Vaccinations needed for students entering Kindergarten, 7th grade, or 12th grade

Parents of students entering <u>Kindergarten</u>, 7th <u>grade</u>, or 12th <u>grade</u> should pay close attention to the requirements, as these are the grades in which additional vaccinations are necessary. Please schedule doctor appointments now to ensure that immunizations are **complete by the first day of school** so that your child is not excluded from school.

If you need assistance obtaining the required immunizations for your child go to dontwaitvaccinate.pa.gov for information. If you have questions about the new regulations or what your child is in need of, please contact the nurse at your child's school.




