JOHN & REGINA HARTMAN AND MARVIN & NORMA THIEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • \$500 may be more than one person • GPA of 2.75 or higher • Non-renewable • Must have demonstrated scholarship achievement, dedication and hard work in school, extracurricular activities, at home and in the community, as well as a commitment to reach personal goals. Award will be withdrawn any year funds are not available
DELBERT AND LUCILLE PALMER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The amount of each award will vary depending upon the number of seniors applying and the funds available. In the past, scholarships have ranged from \$250-\$2500 and as many as 16 were awarded in one year. • 3.0 GPA or higher. • The award is for one year and may be used at any college, university or technical school. • Criteria include academic ability and the likelihood of success. Financial need may be considered. The student must have made a contribution to community and school through participation in school and community activities. Note: once a recipient is awarded this scholarship, he/she can apply each year for three years through an application and interview process held in the spring. Student must have a 3.0 GPA while attending college. Recipients should contact the EAF office for information and application. 	JAMES L. NEWMAN JR.
