Hello, Wellston Rocket community! Here at Wellston Middle School our Physical Education students have been engaged in regular daily exercise as we begin our final semester of the year. Recently, all 6th, 7th, and 8th grade Phys. Ed students have participated in the Fitnessgram PACER test. The FitnessGram PACER Test is a multistage aerobic capacity test that progressively gets more difficult as it continues.

The test is used to measure a student's aerobic capacity as part of the FitnessGram assessment. The test gets quicker as it continues until the student reaches their maximum potential. We will do the PACER 3 times this

semester. Once as a Pre-Test, once at Mid-term and once toward the end of the year. Each student has a goal of increasing their PACER score by a certain percentage. It is fun and rewarding to see their hard work pay off and show them how their hard work helps them succeed.

As we get further into the semester we will begin our sport units. We will soon be learning and playing sports such as badminton, volleyball, softball/baseball, basketball, flag football, soccer, floor hockey, and ultimate frisbee. I am looking forward to a great 2nd semester with my students!
