ART STANDARDS, K-5

Kindergarten

Skills, Knowledge, Concepts

- o Identifies primary and secondary colors, as well as a variety of lines, shapes and textures in a work.
- o Identifies a pattern as repeated lines, shapes and/or colors.
- Demonstrates a creative approach to solving artistic problems. Is willing to take risks and make adjustments as necessary.
- Uses drawing tools and scissors appropriately and can paste/adhere two or more flat surfaces together.
- Demonstrates an appreciation of and critical response to own work and the work of others.

Grade 1

> Skills, Knowledge, Concepts

- o Recognizes lines, patterns and textures in the environment.
- Performs basic printmaking methods (inking, stamping rubbing), paper folding and pinch and pull techniques in sculpture.
- Mixes two primary colors to create a secondary color.
- o Makes revisions and adjustments to work to solve the visual problem.
- o Presents personal opinions about their work and the work of others.

Grade 2

Skills, Knowledge, Concepts

- Renders an object from observation using basic shapes. Can render from different sides and perspectives.
- Weaves paper: overlapping vertically and horizontally.
- o Explores the use of symbols and signs to communicate feelings and ideas.
- o Creates artwork from memory or imagination to tell a story.
- o Describes how the viewer feels about the artwork (personal reaction).

Grade 3

Skills, Knowledge, Concepts

- Changes the value of a color by mixing two colors together (tints and shades) and by controlling pressure on the drawing tool.
- o Recognizes that foreground and background tell you what is close and what is far.
- Uses a variety of paper techniques (cut, fold, tear, curl and pierce).
- Critiques their own work and the work of others using age appropriate vocabulary.
- o Recognizes and appreciates diverse approaches to art: historical, cultural and stylistic.

Grade 4

Skills, Knowledge, Concepts

- o Creates a composition with an intended center of interest, repetition or balance.
- Mixes colors to create a variety of intermediary colors (orange, green, violet).
- Identifies the positive and negative space in a work, and its influence on the composition.
- Creates the illusion of depth (2D surface) by overlapping, size change and placement.
- o Recognizes and discusses the Elements of Art used within a piece.

Grade 5

Skills, Knowledge, Concepts

- o Creates lines and dots to create the illusion of texture on a 2D surface.

- Creates the illusion of depth in an artwork using converging lines and color relationships (bright/dull).
- o Models a three dimensional sculpture (including an assemblage of objects).
- Presents a personal response to the subject matter, materials, techniques, and use of design elements in artworks.
