Elective classes for selected students: If a student is identified as Gifted, the student will take the Gifted Enrichment class. If a student is identified as ESL level 1-5, the student will take the ESL class. In most cases these courses would replace the elective.				
<u>Double-blocked courses</u> : All English and math classes will be double-blocked. This means that students will have English and math every day, and have all other classes every other day.
