#### DIRECT FROM THE DESK OF THE SUPERINTENDENT



What a great year we've had at Eminence Community Schools! On May 26th, we graduated 36 seniors. Nevaya Dickinson was our Valedictorian and Grace Kemp was our Salutatorian. Nevaya was also one of eight Lilly Scholarship Finalists in Morgan County. Additionally, several of our seniors were able to earn scholarships and are moving on to a variety of different post-graduation opportunities. We are very proud of the entire Class of 2023 and wish them much success in their future endeavors.

Our high school girls' basketball team were sectional champions this year and our softball team was the Greater Indianapolis Area Conference (GIAC) Champions with a perfect record in the conference. Also, several of our student-athletes were named as GIAC Academic All-Conference

The agricultural science classes at the high school continue to grow as we were able to add hydroponics and aquaculture to the curriculum this year. This upcoming 2023-2024 school year, we will be adding three dual credit classes in partnership with Ivy Tech. These classes are Animal Science, Survey of Horticulture, and Landscape Design I. We are excited for these new dual credit opportunities which lead to a Graduation Pathway. Additionally, the Future Farmers of America (FFA) program continues to thrive and provides leadership opportunities to our students locally, statewide, and nationally.

Additional dual credit classes taught by Eminence teachers include Introduction to Business, Principles of Marketing, English Composition, Introduction to Literature, Solar System Astronomy, and Physics I. All are offered through Ivy Tech. Finally, in partnership with Indiana State University, we are offering dual credit classes in The Principles of Teaching and The Psychology of Childhood and Adolescence for our Education Professions Pathway. Adding these dual credit courses is great news for our school, as these will assist our families in paying less tuition for their students when they enroll in college.

We have a thriving robotics program at both the elementary level and at the junior-senior high school. Two of our teams, one from each level, qualified for the Indiana State Robotics Tournament this past spring.

We are blessed with a great YMCA here in Morgan County that has partnered with the school on a grant which allows us to offer our families after school care at NO CHARGE. The program provides care for students in grades kindergarten to grade 8 from the time school ends until 6 p.m. each day school is in session. Students are provided tutoring, recreation, and a snack as part of the program.

Safety is one of our top priorities here at Eminence. Many of our staff are trained in the ALICE safety protocol. ALICE stands for Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, and Evacuate, which are steps that are followed in the event that there is a threat at school. We also have two School Resource Officers, one of which is on campus each day school is in session. Additionally, we work closely with the Morgan County Sheriff's Department to keep our school safe. We are grateful not only for the daily vigilance of our Resource Officers, but also for the positive relationships they build with our students.

I am proud to be an Eminence EeI and am looking forward to the future, and especially to the 2023-2024 school year, which promises to be even better than last year!

Finally, I wanted to let you know that we will be opening up online registration the week of July 10th and will offer in person registration again this year on July 18, 19, 25, and 26. We welcome out of district students and will provide building tours during registration if requested. Please check our website for walk in registration times. We look forward to seeing our students for the first day of school on Wednesday, August 9th! Until then, have a safe and enjoyable summer.

Our elementary school is a certified STEM school in Indiana, with a dedicated STEM teacher who provides STEM experiences on a regular basis. Student test scores have increased dramatically at the elementary level again this year and middle school and high school scores are on an upward trajectory as well. In addition, our high school students receive excellent vocational training in a variety of programs at the Area 30 Career Center in Greencastle. **HepB:** The minimum age for the 3rddose of Hepatitis B is 24 weeks of age.

**DTaP**: 4 doses of DTaP/DTP/DT are acceptable if 4thdose was administered on or after child's 4thbirthday.

**Pollo:**\* 3 doses of Polio are acceptable for all grade levels if the 3rddose was given on or after the 4thbirthday and at least 6 months after the previous dose.

\*For students in grades K-12, the final dose must be administered on or after the 4thbirthday and be administered at least 6 months after the previous dose.

Varicella: Physician documentation of disease history, including month and year, is proof of immunity for children entering preschool through 12thgrade. Parent report of disease history is not acceptable.

**Tdap:** There is no minimum interval from the last Td dose.

MCV4: Individuals who receive dose 1 on or after the 16thbirthday only need 1 dose of MCV4.

**Hepatitis A:** The minimum interval between 1stand 2nddose is 6 calendar months, 2 doses are required for all grades Pre-K through 12.

COVID-19: COVID-19 vaccine is recommended for all students five years of age and older per CDC and FDA's Emergency Use Authorization. Review required after FDA full approval.




