This enduring issues check-in provides you with opportunities to review what you have learned and practice the skills you'll need to master the enduring issues essay and to discuss enduring issues in history with your classmates.

	Four Tips for Identifying an Enduring Issue			
)	Base your issue on evidence. You will need to support your choice of enduring issue with evidence from documents or topics you have learned in class, so instead of choosing an issue that you like to write about and trying to find evidence for it, look for evidence of <u>challenges</u> or <u>problems</u> , then identify an issue based on what you find.	3	Be as specific as possible. Instead of choosing "conflict," try identifying an enduring issue like "conflict between ethnic groups" or ""civil wars."	
	Do not stick to the list. If you see evidence of an enduring issue in a set of documents or topics you have learned in class that is not on the list, then choose that one. Do not limit yourself to the list. For example, "hatred," and "pollution" are not on the list, but are enduring issues.	4	Identify causes and/or effects Instead of choosing an issue like "conflict," identify what causes conflict like "conflict caused by competition over resources" or try identifying the effects of an enduring issue. For example, you could write, "conflict has led to human rights violations."
