Frequently Asked Questions

Which class should my student enroll in?

Your student should sign up for the class or classes that best fit their needs. Advanced English 8 is for students above grade level. English 8 is for students at or near grade level in English Language Arts (including reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills). Co-Taught English 8 is for students below grade level in English Language Arts. Here is more information about Co-Taught English 8.

What if my student is receiving Special Education services?

At this time, students receiving Special Education services cannot enroll in Reading, which is an ADSIS program. However, they may still enroll in either Regular 8th Grade English or Co-Taught 8th Grade English and may receive additional skills support in a guided study setting. Please refer to your student's case manager for further recommendations.

My student is currently in an SRA Corrective Reading program. Will they continue to do that? Students receiving Special Education services will be tested to determine their need for the program and may be enrolled in a small group English class if needed. SRA Corrective Reading is not part of the English class curriculum for either Regular or Co-Taught.

Do students who enroll in Advanced English 8 also enroll in Advanced Global Studies?

Yes. Students <u>must</u> enroll in both Advanced English 8 and Advanced Global Studies. These courses are designed to work in parallel with each other and dual enrollment allows for interdisciplinary study.
