Sample Lessons And Activities	 Discuss elements of a paragraph (chart what kids know). After discussing examples of "bad" paragraphs correct the errors. Brainstorm topics and points to support topics, discussing the similarity between the topic and supporting points. Discuss and practice concluding sentences, looking at actual paragraphs. Practice writing paragraphs as a class, with a partner, and individually. Discuss thesaurus usage to replace overused words. Using a thesaurus, work in groups to find synonyms for overused words (ex. big). Read aloud <u>The Ice Chest</u> as an example of descriptive language. Share samples of descriptive language. Using food, such as a cookie, brainstorm how each of the five senses are used; brainstorm words to describe the item; place words on "sensory chart".
