Essential Understandings	 Good readers and researchers ask questions about context in order to understand a work. Essential Questions	 How does one find reliable evidence? How does one avoid plagiarism by taking notes and using information to answer the researcher's question? How does a researcher synthesize information from a variety of sources? How does one apply MLA embedded citations and a Works Cited list to research papers?
Essential Knowledge	 Readers must be able to see where context questions arise and form a specific, researchable question. Researchers must be able to apply background information to the literature studied. Writers must be able to use facts or documented opinions to answer their research question.
