	English Language Arts Students in an ELA classroom will learn to communicate, read, write, and research throughout the year.	Mathematics Students will focus on number sense and computation, measurement, geometry, algebra, and data analysis and probability in each grade level.

	World Languages: Students will comprehend and communicate in languages other than English. Students will learn skills and knowledge in their foreign language classes that support their learning in other classes. World Language courses offer students the opportunity to earn high school credit while still in middle school.		



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- Art: Students will apply creative thinking to communicate personal ideas, experiences, and narratives in works of art. Students will analyze, interpret, and evaluate artwork. Teachers will help students develop communication and collaboration skills for a community of artists.
- Band/Orchestra: Students will build their musical knowledge and skills through experiences in singing, playing instruments, performing rhythms, moving to music, and creating music. Students will use critical thinking to compare and contrast the functions of music and investigate the impact of musicians on the community. Teachers will expose students to music from a variety of cultural influences, styles, composers, and historical periods.
- Physical Education: Students will identify and explain essential health concepts to understand personal health and promote healthy habits.

- AVID: Teachers will prepare students for college readiness and success in a global society. The curriculum features writing, inquiry, collaboration, reading, note-taking and study skills, and college/career/motivational activities.
- Business/Technology: Students will identify
 the elements of digital safety and security best
 practices that pertain to various digital
 communication tools and methods. Teachers will
 help students use various technology and
 digital resources to collect information.

Special Programs

- English Learner: The English Learner (EL)
 program is designed to improve the education
 of students who come from diverse cultural
 backgrounds. The program honors EL
 student's primary language, background
 knowledge, and experiences. EL students
 receive differentiated instruction that helps
 them develop academic language proficiency
 throughout the year.
- International Academy: Our specialized academic program for students who have recently arrived to the country and are at the emerging stages of English acquisition. They work as a team to implement the Internationals Network model for educating immigrant language learners. Students work in heterogeneous groups to complete real-world projects that allow them to explore the content and engage them in explicit language instruction.
