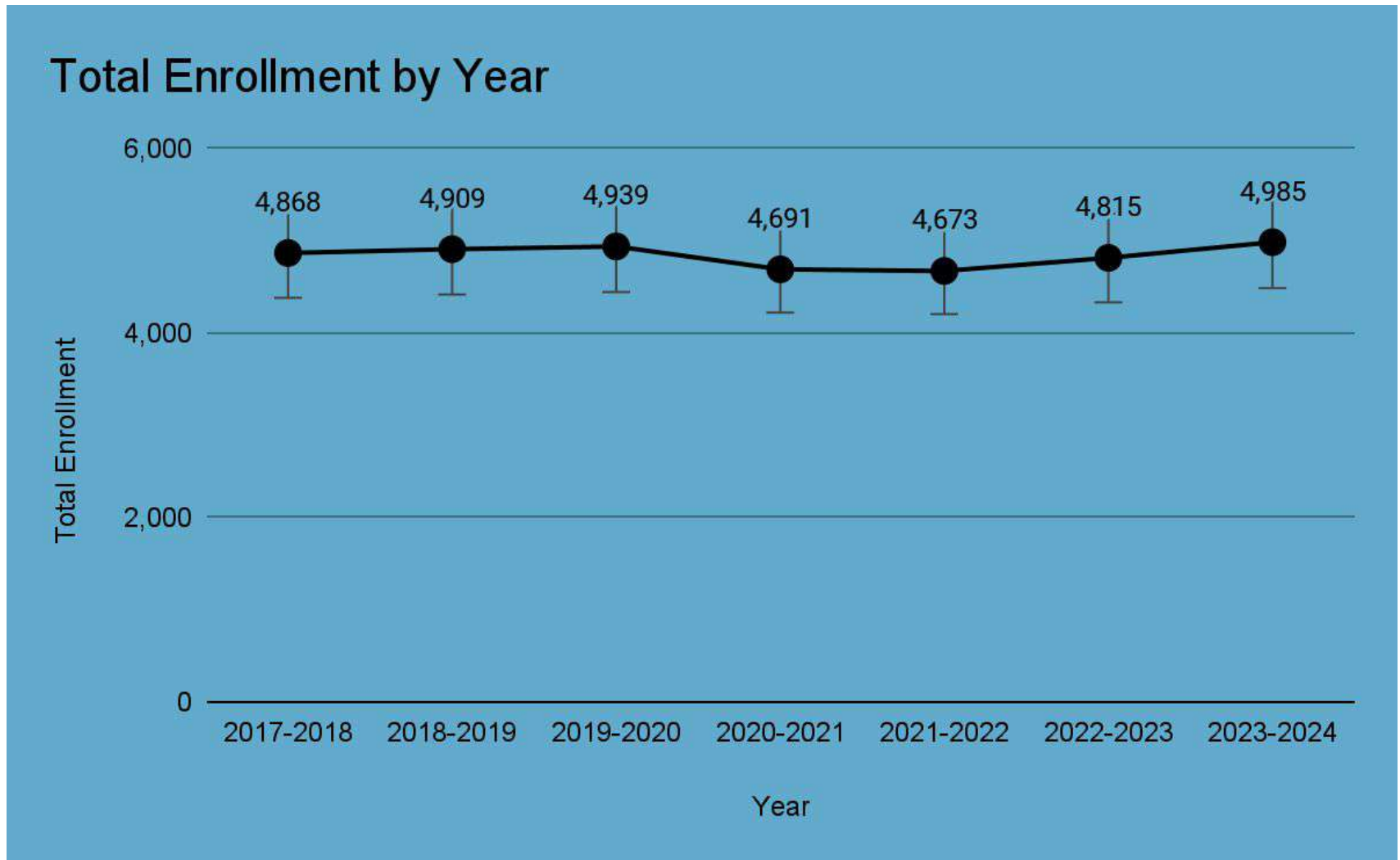

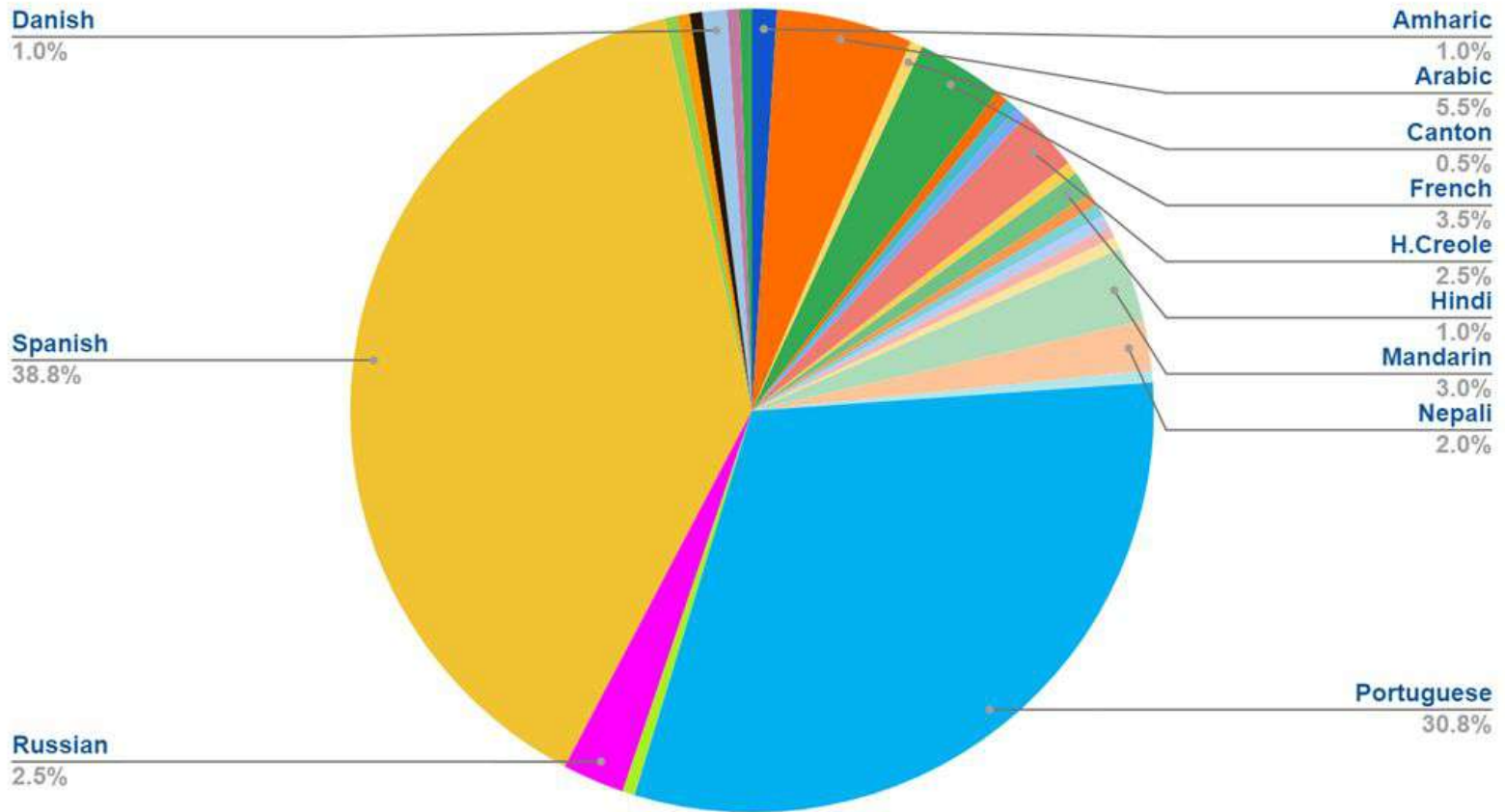
Enrollment has exceeded pre-pandemic levels



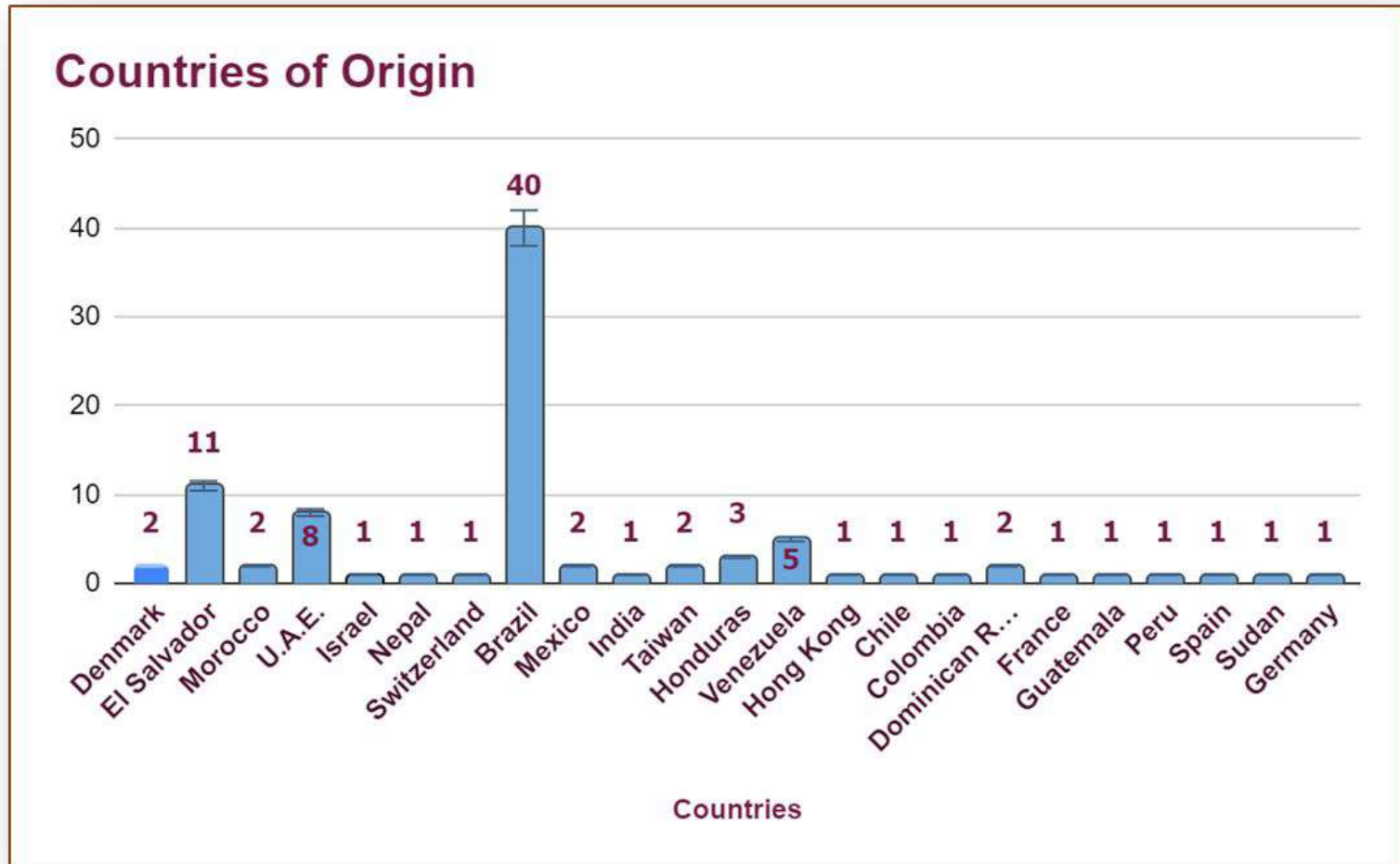

Additional notes

- We collected 2430 responses to the Yearly Student Information Update approximately 50% response rate so far. This form requests updated contact information and collects other essential “Back to School” forms i.e. lunch, handbook, photo permission, and medical permission/updates.
- We continue to enroll families from the United Arab Emirates who live at Assembly Row who have a child needing specialized medical treatment.
- We had 255 summer withdrawals (271 last year) and 173 summer registrations (278 last year).
- 34 Pre-K students assigned to a school chose not to attend (61 last year)
- We currently have 38 students designated as homeless (50 last year) and 21 students in foster care (22 last year). 35 students are being monitored and supported through prevention services to avoid homelessness.
