




echo


(n.) bands, or waves, of noise

volume


(n.) how loud or quiet a sound is

mucus


(n.) the slimy, liquid substance made inside the nose



(v.) to purse your lips together so that you look like a fish or as if you are ready to give someone a kiss


saliva
