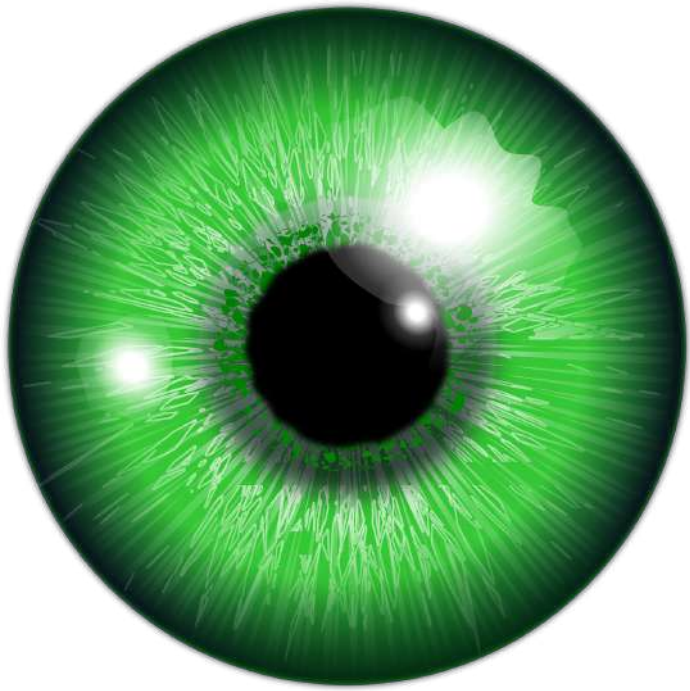
(n.) the act of seeing and looking at things with your eyes

echo

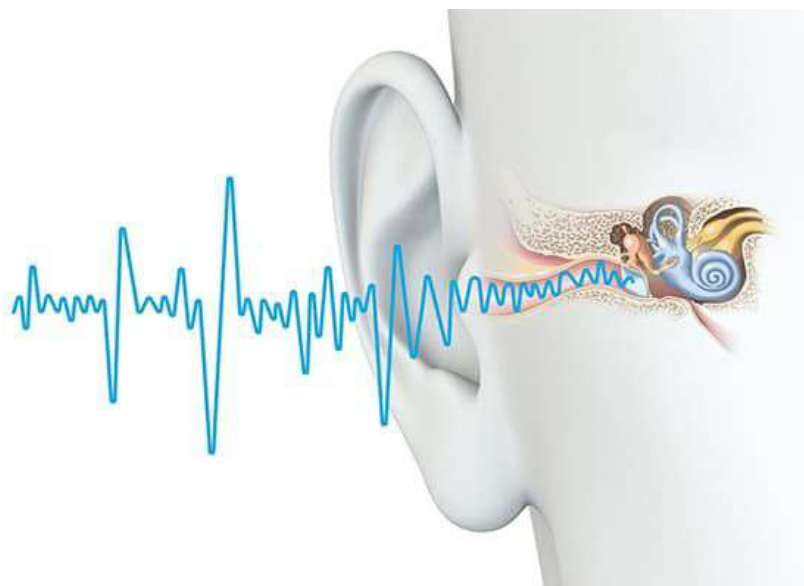
(n.) a sound that you hear again when the sound waves bounce back off something, such as a large mountain or building

(n.) the slimy, liquid substance made inside the nose

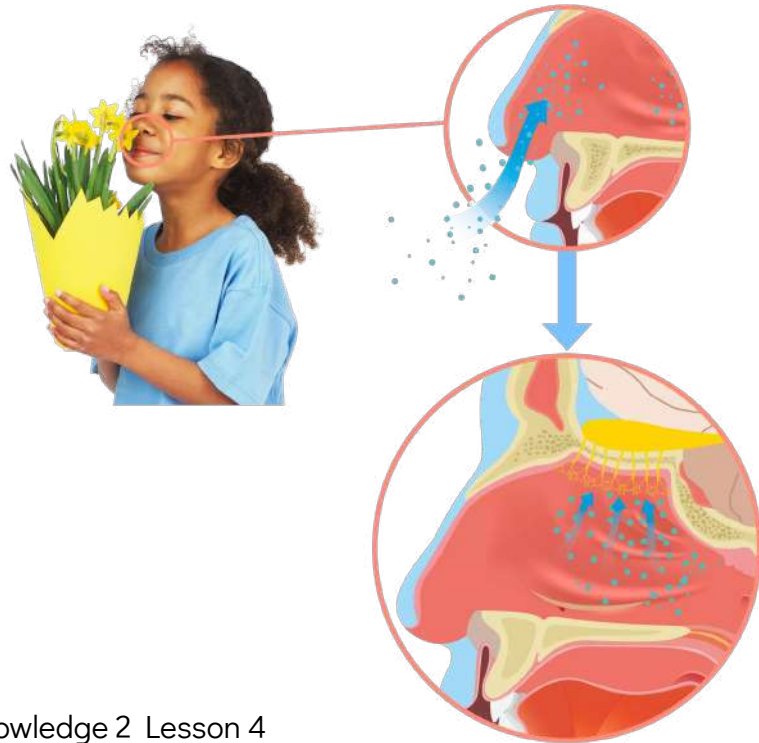

pucker

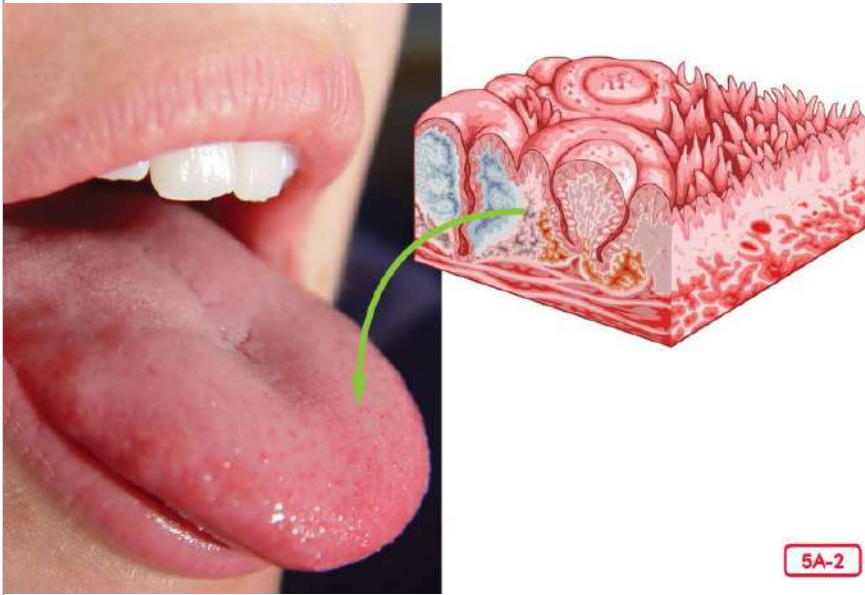
(v.) to purse your lips together so that you look like a fish or as if you are ready to give someone a kiss

saliva

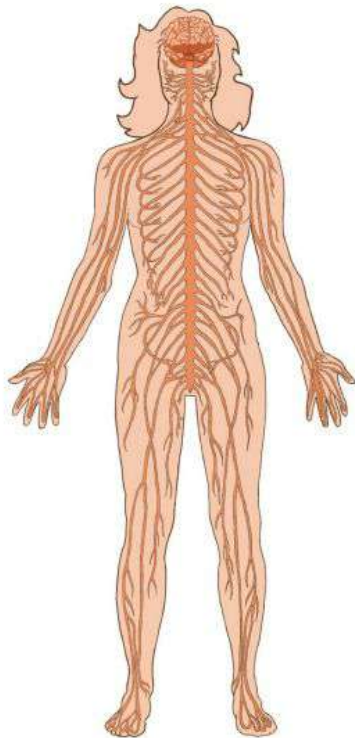
(n.) the watery fluid in the mouth that breaks up food so it is easy to swallow
