3. **Third WIP Photo** will show your progress when your project is about  $\frac{1}{2}$  way to  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a way done with you in it.
4. **Fourth WIP Photo** will show your finished work of art with you in it.
5. **Finished Project Only Photo**

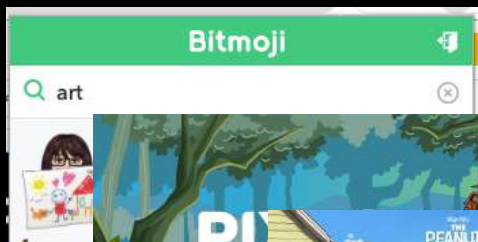

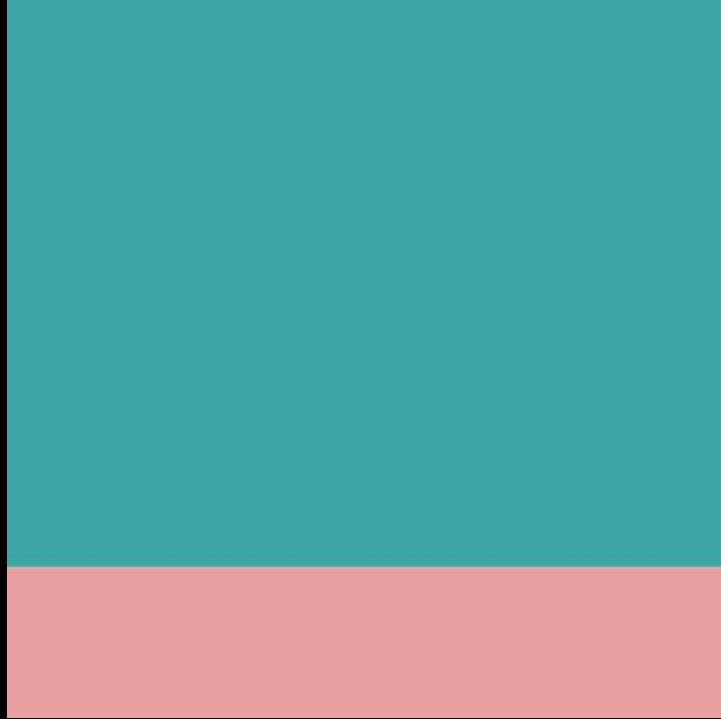

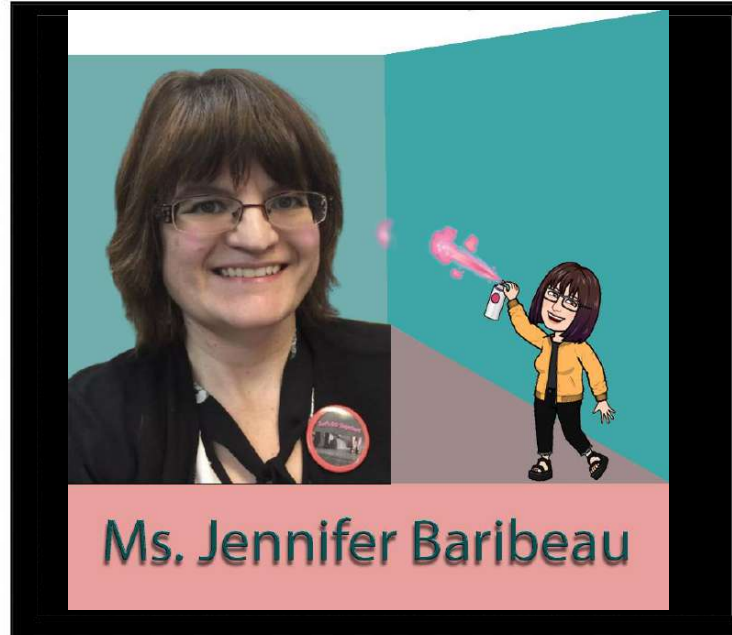
