

# Expectations in 4<sup>th</sup>

## Classroom Behavior/Expectations

We will be using an approach to behavior which encourages students to make positive choices throughout the day. Students will be given a goal number of tickets that they are to earn throughout the month in order to receive the monthly incentive (movie, craft, extra recess, etc.). Student expectations are to follow all school rules as outlined in the school discipline plan found in the student handbook. Major behavior violations will result in immediate discipline actions.

## iPad

Your child will be responsible for his or her iPad, a charging block, and a charging cord that is issued to them from the school. iPads will typically NOT be going home with students this year unless they are needed for remote learning days.

## Grades

Students will receive letter grades on their report card this year. This sometimes is challenging for students to understand as this is something new for them. Parents may view grades through ProgressBook and login codes will be sent home with your child in the first few weeks of school. In order to check your child's progress, you may want to check their grades online.
