EXPLORING ART SYLLABUS

What is art? Discover artists and artistic styles that help define art. Practice using the elements and principles of art to create strong design. Find out about careers in art. Explore the use of many media and techniques such as woodcarving, clay, watercolor, acrylic paint, fibers, printmaking, plaster, junk sculpture, pastels, charcoal, and woodcarving. No experience necessary!

The semester class will partially fulfill the Visual Art Standards; to complete them, a student will need to take an additional semester of art.
