## HIGH SCHOOL PROFILE **2023-2024**

Cold Spring Harbor High School is a New York State public high school with an enrollment of approximately 650 students. Located on Long Island's north shore, the district serves two counties, Nassau and Suffolk. Most residents are college graduates who are active in their professional and business communities and support a rich program of academic offerings and co-curricular activities. Cold Spring Harbor's open enrollment policy provides a setting where students are encouraged to challenge themselves.

The academic emphasis is college preparatory, and the breadth of the curriculum is evident in the availability of numerous courses emphasizing skills development and enrichment, as well as honors, Advanced Placement and elective offerings across all curricular areas. The school's proximity to the famed Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory enables a unique partnership that offers expanded science research opportunities to our students. #### **POINTS OF PRIDE**:

Cold Spring Harbor High School has been ranked by U.S. News and World Report (2023) as No. 1 in Suffolk County and No. 6 on Long Island among public high schools. Individual students, along with the district's academic, athletic, artistic and extracurricular programs, are repeatedly recognized for outstanding achievements and successes. These recognitions include the district being named one of the Best Communities for Music Education by the National Association of Music Merchants; CSH High School literary magazine, Grok, recognized as a Magazine of Excellence by The National Council of Teachers of English; 2023 FIRST National Competition Regional 1 Champions in Robotics; five varsity coaches named Coach of the Year 2023; and DNA Sequencing of Mosquitos student research published in the National Institutes of Health National Center for Biotechnology Information Database. All varsity teams have qualified for the past 11 years as New York State Scholar Athlete Teams.

#### **Grading System**

Grades for all subjects, except pass/fail and physical education courses, are used in computing the cumulative grade point average at the end of grade 11. When a student repeats a course, the course with the higher grade is used in computing grade point average; however, both courses will still remain on the transcript. Honors and Advanced Placement courses are weighted by 1.1.

Grade point averages for transfer students include only those grades earned at Cold Spring Harbor High School.

Students are not assigned a rank in class.
