

# **Mask Styles**

# **HEPA Vacuum Bag Face Mask**

This style mask uses HEPA vacuum bags. It is a duckbill-style mask using a vacuum bag, along with a glue gun, pipe cleaner and elastic.

#### **DIY Overhead Face Mask**

This style mask uses both a lining and main (aka fashion) fabric with tightly woven cotton. This version has elastic that wraps all the way around your head for comfort during long-term wear.

## **Upcycled T-Shirt Face Mask**

This style mask is similar to the one made above, but is simplified for those who may not have a sewing machine — or who may have run out of elastic. All you need is a clean T-shirt and a pair of **scissors** 

# **Olson-Style Face Mask**

This style mask features like a filter pocket and nose bridge seal to help close the gap between your fabric and skin

#### **No-Sew Folded Face Mask**

For this style mask, you only need three items — two fresh hair ties and some fabric — to make this face mask. Consider it a fast, simple way to whip one up with stuff you have lying around the house.

#### **Pleated No-Elastic Face Mask**

This style mask uses pleats. it allows it to get bigger and smaller as needed, offering up more fit options for a variety of face shapes and sizes. This mask style has comfortable ties that won't tug on your ears. Bonus: if you aren't able to find bias tape in stock, you can totally <a href="make your own">make your own</a> from any spare fabric you have lying around.

### **Pleated Surgical Style Face Mask**


This pleated style mask uses <u>elastic</u> that wraps around your ears. (Pro tip: thinner elastic tends to be more comfortable.) You can make one in roughly five minutes, meaning it's easy to bust out a bunch for the whole fam.

## **Pleated-Style With a Filter Pocket**

Another pleated-style face mask that goes around your ears, this version includes a filter pocket, so additional barriers can be placed inside if needed.
