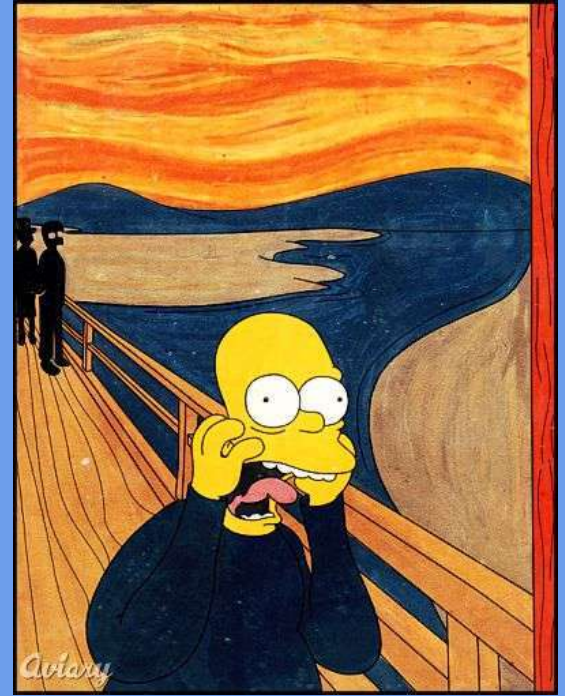


Famous Artwork Parodies

Girl with a Pearl Earring, Vermeer

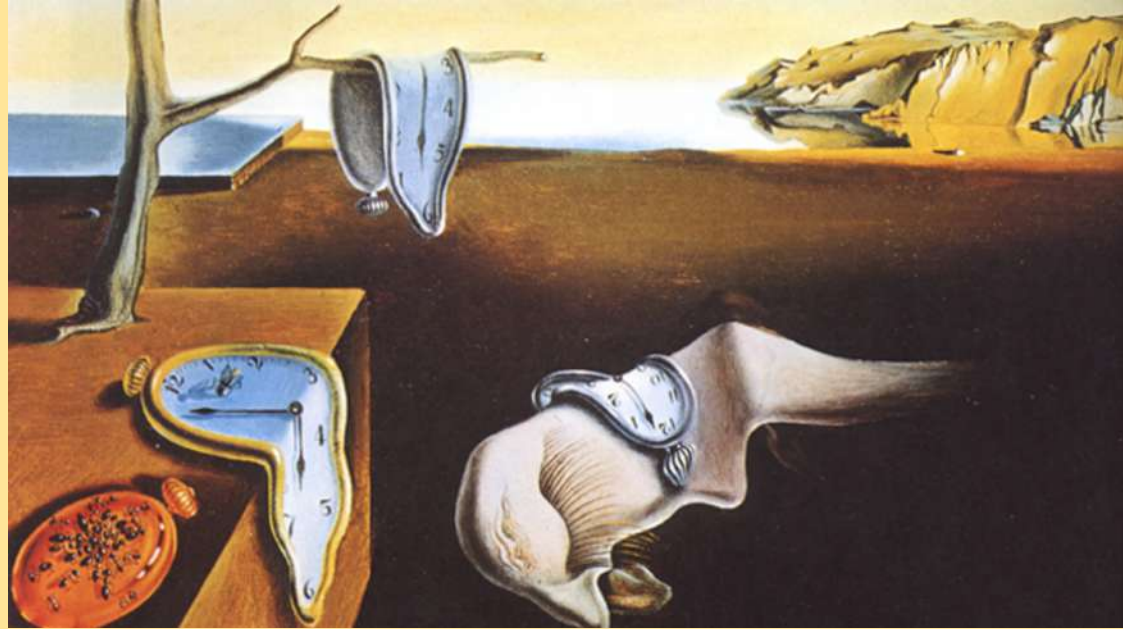

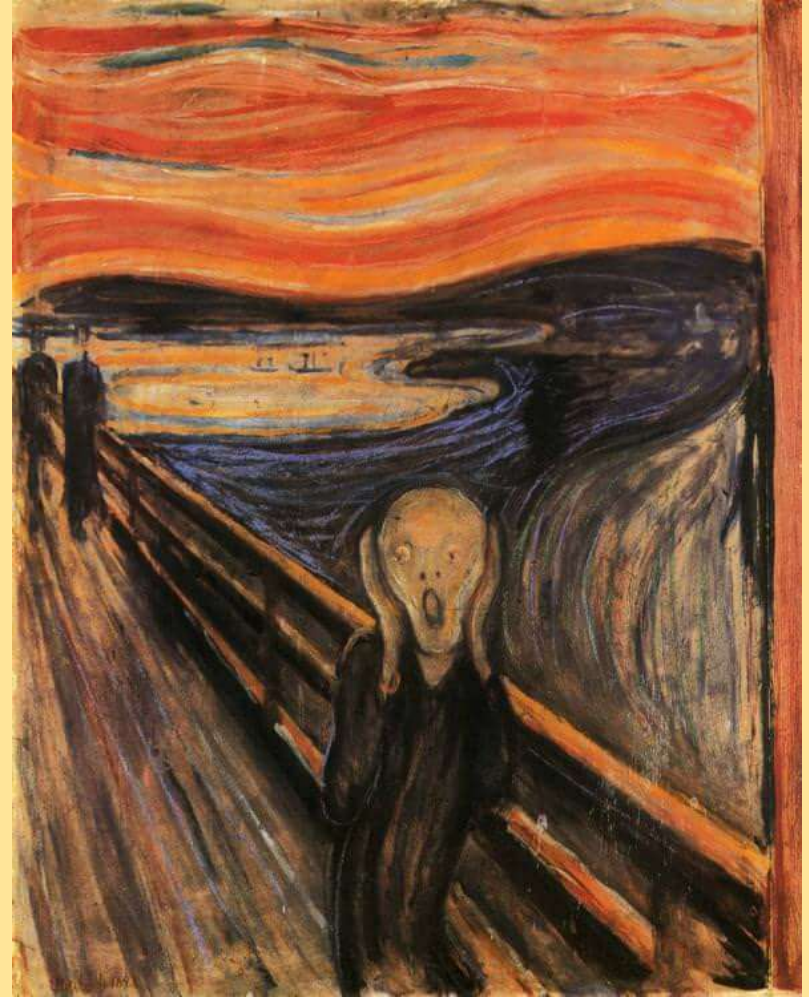

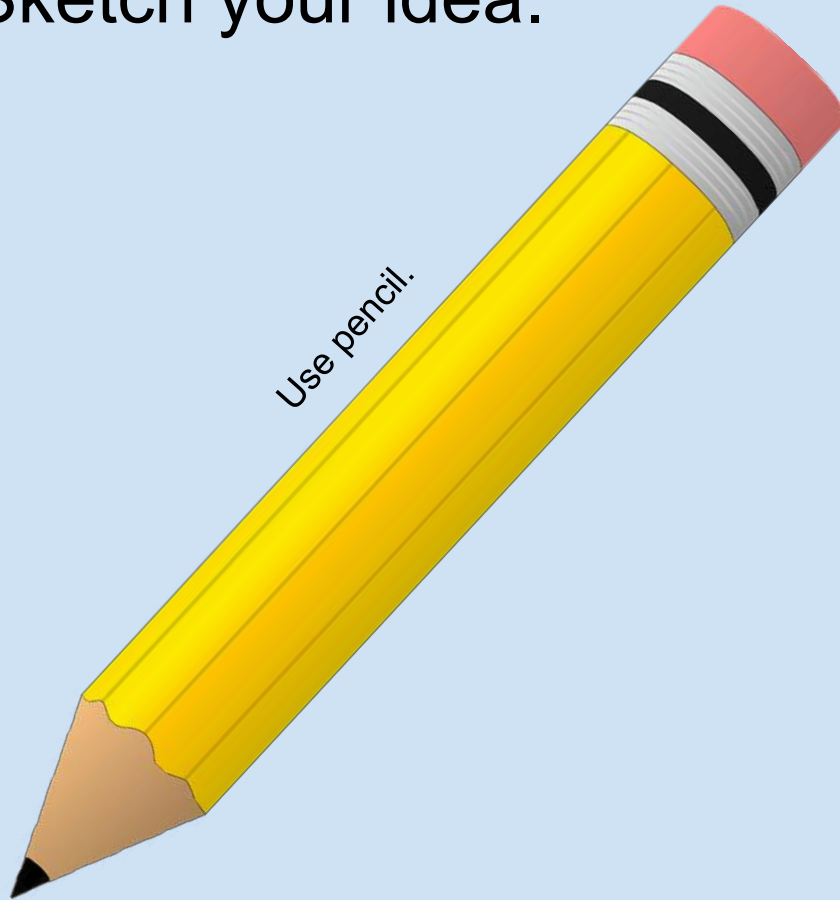

A little more blending and value.



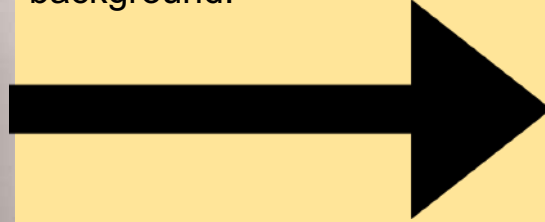
Variations in colors and value.



5. Don't forget to complete the entire artwork.

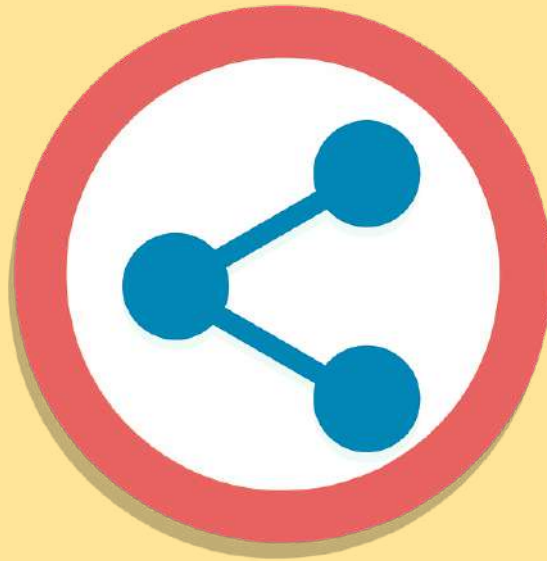


Make sure you include the background!
