Famous Photographer's Research Project

3 Parts: Research Paper, Slide Show Presentation, & Recreating an Image

DIRECTIONS

Students will be able to create a detailed Google presentation about a famous photographer of their own choosing and present it to the class within a five minute time frame. This allows for every student to be an expert on one photographer in addition to learning about several other photographers from their peers. Students will utilize their information and imagery research skills, writing, and critical thinking skills. In addition, this lesson is differentiated for students who enjoy using technology, learning about art history, and applying their artistic skills in their school work.

Steps:

- 1. **Select a photographer** whose work you like. Example...if you like portrait photographer, select a photographer skilled in shooting portraits. As you're looking at your photographer's work, be thinking about the how you might recreate one. Choose a photographer that you will do your research project on from the list below.
- 2. **Research.** TAKE YOUR TIME! As you're doing your research, save the links to photos shot by your photographer. You will use them in for multimedia project. Also copy and paste URL's of sites you are using information from. They will be needed when creating your multimedia project. Create a 15-20 slide powerpoint.
 - a. Great research locations include:

 - ii. The library! Most famous photographers have a biography and several photograph books published. Search the San Jose Library.
 - iii. http://famous-photographers.com/
 - ***Note: Wikipedia is not a reliable source.***
- 3. **Present** Present your 5 minute powerpoint presentation to the class.
- 4. **Recreate one image** that your photographer took. Put a lot of time and thought into this. You can view links to each of these photographers here on the right hand side nav bar. Do not follow this school's instructions, just use the links available.

PowerPoint Presentation Guidelines

INFORMATION

All of the bulleted information must be covered in your presentation.

- Full name of individual
- At least 10 images that represent their style
- Date and place of birth & indicate years of life (and if still living)
- How influenced-by others in field of photography
- How influenced-by circumstances in life
- Awards, fellowships, grants, etc. (explain nature of award)
- Typical subject matter of photographs made by this artist
- What this artist is trying/ tried to communicate
- Typical style of work
- Geographic places this photographer shot
- Significant contribution(s) to photography (or the art world)
- What they themselves said/say about their work (quotes OK)
- What others have said about the work

PRESENTATION REQUIREMENTS

- Select a layout, design, background, font, and animation for your presentation.
- Every slide should have relevant information and/or an image that students write about in the slide or verbally explain.
- Information and imagery should be presented chronologically if possible.
- The final presentation should be **15-25 slides**.
- Final presentations will be saved on **student Google Drive** and turned into Canvas when finished for grading!
- You will be presenting your Photographer's Profile to the class. Presentation should last 5 minutes.

CREDITING YOUR SOURCES

- Everything must be cited!
- Create an informal bibliography slide at the conclusion of your presentation listing where you obtained your information.
- You must hyperlink images to the web pages where they were found. Here is a guide to hyperlinking your images: http://www.ehow.com/how 5871481 images-powerpoint.html

Part 4: Recreate a photo shot by your Famous Photographer

- 1. Select one photo shot by the photographer you profiled, and try and recreate it and shoot it yourself.
- 2. Consider the lighting, setting, technical aspects of recreating your photograph. Be creative!
- 3. Feel free to use school appropriate props.
- 4. It can be done in the classroom, in school, on-location or at home.
- 5. Submit the photo you shoot with the original photo shot by your photographer. This photo should be used in your presentation.
