

- Complete value scale worksheet.
- Plan layout, land design and terrain using the worksheet.
 Practice drawing trees, mountains and other features.
- Pour rice onto paper and trace around to create islands and land. Use a pencil.
- > Add color using marker or watercolor.
- > Trace over all pencil lines using a fine point sharpie.
- > Tear edges of paper if you would like.







LEARNING INTENTIONS & SUCCESS CRITERIA

- > Students will plan the areas of their map on a worksheet.
- Students will create a name for their unique map, 6 locations, one sea creature and a compass

- I added personal details added in each area (ex. Artist Isle, Introvert Island, Landon's Landing)
- ➤ I drew a compass, key and/or other symbolic features.

- > I used hatching or another value shading techniques.
