Focusing on Cooperation with Others

Helping develop a child's teamwork skills and capabilities is crucial when it comes to their future. Cooperation is a necessary skill all children must have if they wish to succeed in working with others in their school and home environments. Without these skills, your child may be more likely to distance themselves from others, and be less cooperative at those moments when it's most needed. As a parent, you can help your children develop their cooperative skills with both adults and other children. If you feel your child isn't responding to your efforts, there are a variety of methods you can try.

Work on Team-Building at Home

By making sure your child actively engages in chores, homework, and play time with their siblings or other people in the house, you'll ensure these behaviors naturally carry over into the school environment. If your child withdraws from these scenarios and doesn't want to work or play with anyone at home, this can indicate potential problems in school as well. Communicating effectively and staying firm in your stand for your child's cooperation will eventually help them see that being part of a team and working with others is both fun and rewarding. This can be especially difficult for shy children, but they'll take plenty of cues from you if you're persistent and consistent. Try different approaches of communication to see which ones work for you and your child.

Talk to Teachers about Your Child's Teamwork in School

Even though your child may be willing to work with others at home, this may be because they are in a much more comfortable atmosphere with people they have known their whole life. Make sure you speak to the teachers and adults your child is directly involved with in order to get a full sense and understanding of their behaviors. Teachers will generally be happy to recommend a few activities you can engage in that will improve their sense of teamwork and cooperation.

Woodland Elementary Music Concerts

Following recommended protocols, we will be providing separate grade-level performances the second week of March. There will be a section reserved for those who request socially distanced seating. We will be recording, potentially live streaming, these events. Please look for details as the date approaches. We are also going to host an open final dress rehearsal in the gym on concert day at **1:00 for 3rd and 1st grade** and **1:45 for 4th and 2nd grade**. We are asking that families please limit guests to four per student for both daytime and evening performances.

This is a special event, so it would be great to have students dress nicely!

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

When monitoring for COVID-19 symptoms, parents/guardians and students should look for:

Major symptoms (Students should stay home and take a COVID-19 test if **ONE** symptom from this list is present): Fever (above 100.4), cough (above baseline), new loss of taste/smell, trouble breathing/shortness of breath

Minor symptoms (Students should stay home and take a COVID-19 test if **TWO** symptoms from this list are present): Congestion/runny nose (above baseline), chills, nausea/vomiting, diarrhea, headache (above baseline), body aches, unusual fatigue, sore throat (above baseline)

Keep your child home when:

- They are sick
- They are diagnosed with COVID-19
- They are being tested for COVID-19

COVID protocols vary on a case-by-case basis, but are based on CDC/Wisconsin DHS guidelines. Generally however, protocols will be:

Tests positive for COVID-19	Unvaccinated or vaccinated	Option 1: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Stay home for 5 days• If you have no symptoms or your symptoms are significantly improved, you can return to school on day 6• Wear a mask for days 6 to 10 Option 2: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Stay home for 10 days, return on day 11
Has COVID-19 symptoms	Unvaccinated	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Stay home• Take a COVID-19 test• Stay home while awaiting test results• Return to school with a negative result• Begin quarantine with a positive result (or if do not test)
Has COVID-19 symptoms	Vaccinated	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Follow typical illness protocol, stay home until 24 hours fever free• COVID-19 test encouraged
Is a close contact to a positive case	Unvaccinated	Option 1: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Quarantine for 5 days after the last contact with a positive case. Test on day 5 and with a negative result return on day 6 (provide a copy of the testing site's negative result to the office)• Continue to wear a mask for days 6 to 10 Option 2: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Quarantine for 10 days after the last contact with a positive case, return on day 11
Is a close contact to a positive case	Vaccinated	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Remain in school and monitor for symptoms for 10 days• Mask for 10 days
Is a close contact and had COVID-19 in last 90 days	Unvaccinated or vaccinated	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Remain in school and monitor for symptoms for 10 days• Mask for 10 days

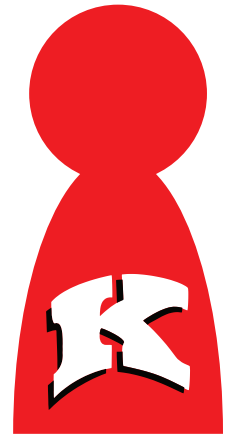

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS



IF YOUR FAMILY LIVES IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

In a shelter



In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation



In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station



Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

Your school-age children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

Your eligible children have the right to:

- Receive a free, appropriate public education.
 - Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
 - Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
 - Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference.
- * If the school district believes that the school you select is not in the best interest of your children, then the district must provide you with a written explanation of its position and inform you of your right to appeal its decision.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if you request this.
 - Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to your children's needs.

If you believe your children may be eligible, contact the local liaison to find out what services and supports may be available. There also may be supports available for your preschool-age children.
