

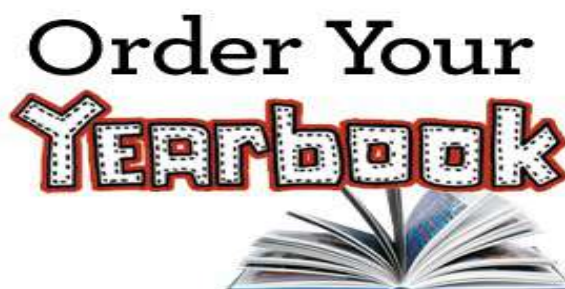

Winter iChat

Many of our sixth grade students will be having their second iChat meeting of the school year during the winter months. As we continue to support our students' Academic and Career Planning (ACP) development, it is important to remember to highlight those skills that are sometimes overlooked on the report card but are so essential to life success. The skills we are referring to go by many names; soft skills, employability skills, learning habits, and skills for success, to name a few. We will look at what researchers have identified as essential soft skills to have in order to find success in college and/or career. Being a member of the workforce is a few years away for our 6th graders, but the skills that are needed to be a productive member of that workforce can be developed now.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS



IF YOUR FAMILY LIVES IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

In a shelter



In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation



In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station



Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

Your school-age children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

Your eligible children have the right to:

- Receive a free, appropriate public education.
 - Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
 - Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
 - Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference.
- * If the school district believes that the school you select is not in the best interest of your children, then the district must provide you with a written explanation of its position and inform you of your right to appeal its decision.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if you request this.
 - Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to your children's needs.

If you believe your children may be eligible, contact the local liaison to find out what services and supports may be available. There also may be supports available for your preschool-age children.
