Happy New Year! It is hard to believe that the second half of the school year is here, and it is time to celebrate the success we have had throughout the first semester! The winter school activities are going full steam. Wrestling, Basketball, FFA, and BPA activities are keeping the school busy. Please take the time to support your children's activities as they are an important part of a comprehensive education.

In December, our District completed an OPI School Nutrition Programs Administrative Review. The review is to ensure schools provide nutritious meals and promote healthy lifestyles through collaborative education and training, and administration of the USDA School Nutrition Programs. We are very proud of our food program. Our staff works hard to provide quality breakfasts and lunches for our kids.

The bus fleet has been inspected for the second time this year by the Montana Highway Patrol. Section [61-9-502](#) , MCA, requires that the Montana Highway Patrol perform semiannual inspections of school buses. The first semiannual inspection is prior to the beginning of the first semester. The second semiannual inspection must be no later than January 31. We are very fortunate to have excellent drivers and a mechanic on our staff to ensure the buses are well equipped and ready to run, especially in the inclement weather we have endured the last few months.

Fast fact: For the 2018-2019 School Year, Sun River Valley Public Schools employed 61 individuals who worked a total of 83,139 hours.

~ A Message from the Fort Shaw Elementary Principal ~

Hello Sun River Valley! We have had a great finish to 2019 and a wonderful start in 2020!

Before Christmas break, our school put on a Christmas Concert that was fantastic, engaged in holiday projects like candy trains (4th gr.) and gingerbread houses (kindergarten & 2nd gr.), and had our first Career Day Assembly.

Deputy Horn from the Cascade County Sheriff's Office presented for our first career focus. He talked about what his career is like, why he likes being a deputy and chose that profession, and showed the students a lot of cool things! Deputy Horn also spoke about what it means to stay safe, get along with others, and work together. We are planning on having more people present about their careers throughout the school year. Our new members for our student leadership team (Tiger Team) were announced right before the holiday break. The new team is: Bailey Anderson and Grace Standley (5th), Cadence Crookston and Bri Miller (4th), Jack Rasmussen and Sarah Hane (3rd), and Leif Bergman and Joslynn DeShaw (2nd). They will do a wonderful job, and I'm excited to work with them! The team meets weekly with me to discuss how to improve the school climate, if they have noticed any problems that need addressed, and plans Minute-To-Win-It assemblies. The team is our official "morning greeters." They take turns greeting all students and staff as they make their way to class first thing in the morning. This has been very positive for our students to have these types of interactions. You would be amazed at the number of students that didn't make eye contact or respond to their peers when told good morning. This has since shifted, and students have learned how to respond appropriately and are equipped with important life skills!

Fort Shaw Elementary is going to be starting a Gifted and Talented Program. The students who participate will be selected based on academic performance and the type of activities being taught. For instance, we are going to start with a science-based session; so students who are gifted in that area will work with a community member learning material and creating projects or experiments. Students will meet twice a month. Grades 2-5 will be the main focus, but students from other grades may be put in the program depending on the content area. It is a work in progress, but we are very excited to offer this opportunity to our kids! If you or someone you know feels they have an area of expertise that you think would benefit our school and could work with top level students, please contact me.

Students recently participated in the MANG (Montana Army National Guard) Obstacle Course at Simms. They had a blast testing their strength and agility weaving their way through various obstacles! Thank you to the National Guard for coming and providing our students this opportunity. I would also like to thank Mr. Hazenberg, Mr. Kinna, and Mr. McKinley at the high school for allowing our students to participate.

Our students were visited by the Speech & Drama team from the high school who taught them about different areas that they compete in. They did a wonderful job performing for our students and engaging them in different activities! Thank you to Mrs. Davidson and Simms High School Speech and Drama Team for taking the time to work with our young kids.

We have made recent additions to our Tiger Lounge due to some donations from the Sociables, United Methodist Women from Sun River Methodist Church, and Fort Shaw Homemakers. Many games and activities have been purchased so our students can build, create, and play games that challenge their critical thinking and strategic skills.
